In the name of god amens. I James Turner of the Parish  
of Saint George, in the County of Northampton & Province of North  
Carolina, being sick & weak but of perfect mind & memory, do make  
this my last & ult' testament as followeth.

In witness of your bequeath unto my wife Martha Turner the share of her  
fortune as per legoay of her father alive, except the sum  
of one hundred fifti Pounds Current Money of Virginia I  
further give bequeath unto the said Martha Turner four  
young Wifys Henry, Lucy, Sarah & Kate, during her life & after  
wards to be sold & Equally divided betwixt my four chil-  
dren, Mary Turner, Elizabeth Turner, Etheldred Turner  
& Edmund Turner. & further give bequeath unto my  
wife Martha Turner according old' st bay mare  
and the use of my manor Plantation during her widowhood  
provided she will bear on it.

Item I give Bequeath unto my daughter Mary Turner  
four sugar wifys & two butchines, Young Grocer &  
her Cham of all my young mans, to her the hirs forw:

Item I give Bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Turner  
four sugar wifys, two butchines, to her the hirs forw:

Item I give Bequeath unto my son Etheldred Turner my  
land adjoining Doctor Cathcart's land on Robinsake,

Containing four hundred and eighteen acres uppon Negro  
Townie, Hannah, Diner, & Sam to him the hirs forw:  
Item I give Bequeath unto my son Edmund Turner all the other  
Land I now own, it lying on the North side of Roanoke River  
or partly in this County & Province, & partly in Southampton  
and County of Virginia & four Negroes for Henry, Sampson  
Lucy, which negroes to be kept upon the upper Plantation,  
Called & known by the name of Green, to him the hirs forw:  
Item I give Bequeath to my youngest daughter Anna Turner four  
Negroes wif,all. a fgg, Jacob & Ned.

Item The Land I give my son Etheldred Turner I do appoint  
William Pace, Jr., Benjamin Branch Jr., William  
Cathcart & Seymour Somersell or any three of them  
to value the on half of which Value to be paid to allow  
Joseph Miller Jones out of my Estate that is to be sold.

Item The residue of my Estate which is not already given  
except Thirty Pounds Virginia Current to my son  
Etheldred Turner & my third to my son Edmund Turner  
which I doth give Bequeath, being sold by my executors  
for Virginia Current, after my just debts paid, to be  
Equally divided betwixt my four children Wifys, Mary  
Turner, Elizabeth Turner, Etheldred Turner, Edmund  
Turner & Anna Turner.

Item I desire that my two sons be bound out at the age of fifteen to learn  
the trade of a Carpenter or Cooper.

Lastly I do hereby appoint my wife Martha Turner executrix  
of my brother William Turner, Executer of this my last & ult'  
testament. In witness whereof I have becaunto set my hand  
that this thirtieth Day of March Anno Domini one thousand seven  
hundred Sixty Eight. James Turner & seal  
signed sealed pronounced & acknowledged in presence of Wm. & the above  
intended by my executors was done before signed.
