Named Solomon & have Paid and Proc Money to him this hours  
forwars

My will & desire is that all my Land and other Estate of what  
kind or nature soever which I have not already given  
away, shall be sold at the discretion of my executors & the money  
arising from the same & the money that is owing me to be equally  
divided between my three sons William Nagland the  
Jr. John Nagland & Thomas Nagland, after my just debts  
& funeral charges are discharged.

I herby constitute & appoint my brother William Flagland  
& JohnNeil my executors of this my last will & testament.  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this  
19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1771. George Flagland &ascal

lambation money. I leave the use of my Land & Plantation with  
all the rest of my Estate to my Wife Mary During her natural  
life, and then I give her unto the same Land & Plantation  
with all other part of my Estate to my Daughter Lauren to her  
& her heirs. I leave my Daughter Susanna & William Mabry each  
to her my last will & testament made this 7<sup>th</sup> day of Decr 1770.
