I Give the quarter unto my daughter Rebecca Gay one Cow & calf
one small dish & one plate.

I Give the quarter unto my daughter Patience Whaler one Cow &
calf one Basin & one plate.

I Give to my daughter Sally Jones five shillings

I Give to my Grand son James Whaler one two year
old heifer

I Give to my Grand daughter Mary Jones one two year
old heifer

I Give to my Grand son Thomas Gay 3d of money

I Give bequeath unto my loving wife Patience Whaler all the
remainder of my Estate during her natural life she may her
dispose & further. I do nominate & appoint George Bark-
ley my whole sole Executor of this my last will & testament
in witness whereof I have set my hand & seal this 1st day of
Jan 1779

Elizabeth Mutton's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Elizabeth Mutton of the County
of Wampum & State of North Carolina being of sound mind
memory & make & ordain this my last will & testament &
disposal of my lawfully Estate in manner & form following
It my will & desire is that all my negroes be kept in the hands
of my Executors for the support of my children until my
Eldest Daughter comes to lawful age or married then
to be equally divided between my two children
It is also my will & desire that all my Estate that is not above
mentioned shall be sold by my Executors not Sheriff
giving him months credit & the money arising therefrom
to be equally divided between my two daughters.
And lastly I do nominate & appoint James Crumpton Thomas
Parker whole Executors of this my last will & testament.

William Vaughan's Will

In the name of God Amen, I William Vaughan of W
Ampton County in the State of North Carolina being sick
and weak but of sound mind memory and understanding
and Calling to mind the Certainty of death and the Vanishing
of this time thereof do make and ordains this my last will
and testament in manner and form following (Wit) I do
and confirm it is my will and desire that all my just
debts and funeral expences be discharged by my Executors
hereafter named. Secondly I do to my will bequeath

wife then Vaughan all my Estate that I do not hereafter give ⁱⁿ legacies during his life or marriage and then to be equally divided amongst all my Children or the survivors of them. Thirdly I leave my land to my wife during her widowhood. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son John Vaughan my land and plantation and one half of my turners tools and one third the smallest that I have to him and his heirs forever. Fifthly It is my will and desire that my Young mare and half my Turners tools be sold by my Ex^{or} and the money put at Interest till my son Frederick Vaughan come to the age of Twenty one Years and then the same to be given to him and his heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint John Row and John Vaughan of this my last will and Testament conforming this and only this to be my last will in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal This Brightenth day of Oct 1779

Andrew Jarver's Will

In the name of God Amen I Andrew Jarver of the County of Northampton & State of Maryland being of disposing mind & memory do constitute & ordain this my last will & Testament & dispose of my worldly Estate as follows.

1st I give bequeath to my daughter Mary Jarver an negro man named Mingo & one bed of furniture now in the possession

- of her husband Jacob Jarver to her & her heirs forever
 2^d I give bequeath unto ^{my daughter} Elizabeth Jarver one negro Man named Peter & one bed of furniture now in the possession of her husband & her heirs forever
 3^d I give bequeath unto my daughter Sarah & her one bed of furniture
 4th I give bequeath unto my daughter Linda & her one negro boy named Mark & one bed of furniture now in the possession of her husband John & her heirs forever
 5th I give bequeath unto my daughter Patience & her one negro girl named Peg & her increase & one bed of furniture to her & her heirs forever
 6th I give bequeath unto my daughter Prue Jarver one feather bed of furniture & also one negro woman named Mall during her life & provide she marries I give the negro male but not her increase to her & her heirs forever
 7th I leave unto my wife Elizabeth Jarver one negro man named Kelliford one negro woman named Baphny during her widowhood
 8th My will & desire is that all that part of my Estate both real & personal which I have not disposed of be continued in the hands of my son John Jarver for the support of the brother until my youngest son comes to lawful age & then to be equally divided amongst my four sons & it is also my will that the negroes Kelliford & Baphny which I have but unto my wife be equally divided amongst the Brothers when they come from her & the wife & that Mall & her increase be ^{likewise} equally divided amongst the four Brothers. And I do hereby nominate & appoint my son John Jarver my whole sole Ex^{or} of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have signed sealed & delivered in presence of,
