one plate & a cow & calf & one feather bed.

Item I give the quarter unto my daughter Rebecca Gay one Cow calf
one small sick & one plate.

Item I give bequeath unto my daughter Patience Wheeler one Cow &
Calf one Basin & one plate.

Item I give to my daughter Sally Jones five shillings

Item I give to my Grand son James Wheeler one two year
old heifer

Item I give ^{bequeath} to my Grand Daughter Mary Jones one two year
old heifer

Item I give to my Grand son Thomas Gay 30 of money

Item I give bequeath unto my loving wife Patience Wheeler all the
remainder of my Estate during her natural life she may her
dispose & further. I do nominate & appoint George Bark
by my whole sole executor of this my last will & testament
in witness whereof I have set my hand seal this 17 day of
June 1779

Elizabeth Mutton's Will

In the name of God Amen, I Elizabeth Mutton of the County
of Wampum State of North Carolina being of sound mind
memory do make & ordain this my last will & testament &
disposal of my worldly Estate in manner & form following
It my will & desire is that all my negroes be kept in the hand
of my Executors for the support of my children until my
Eldist Daughter comes to lawful age or married then
to be equally divided between my two children

It is also my will & desire that all my Estate that is not above
mentioned shall be sold by my Executors not Sheriff
giving nine months credit & the money arising therefrom
to be equally divided between my two daughters.

And lastly I do nominate & appoint James Crump Thomas
Parker whole Executors of this my last will & testament.

William Vaughan's Will

In the name of God Amen, I William Vaughan of W.
County N. C. in the State of North Carolina being sick
and weak but of sound mind memory and understanding
and Calling to mind the Certainty of death and the shortness
of this time thereof do make and ordain this my last will
and testament in manner and form following (viz) I do
and foremost it is my will and desire that all my just
debts and funeral expenses be discharged by my Executors
hereafter named. Secondly I do to my will bequeath

wife Ann Vaughan all my Estate that I do not hereafter give, Legacies during his life or marriage and then to be equally divided amongst all my Children or the survivors of them. Thirdly, I bind my land to my wife during her widowhood. Fourthly I give and bequeath to my son John Vaughan my land and plantation and one half of my Turners tools and one Sixth the smallest that I have to him and his heirs forever. Fifthly It is my will and desire that my Young mare and half my Turners tools be sold by my Exor^s and the money put at Interest till my son Frederick Vaughan come to the age of Twenty one Years and then the same to be given to him and his heirs forever.

Lastly I appoint John Row and John Vaughan of this my last will and Testament conforming this and only this to be my last will in all things whereof I have knowledge at my hand and affixed my seal This Brightest day of Oct. 1779

I give bequeath to my daughter Mary Jarver an negro man named Mingo & one bed of furniture now in the possession

- of her husband Jacob Jarver to her & her heirs forever
 I give bequeath unto ^{my daughter} Elizabeth Harris one negro man named Peter & one bed of furniture now in the possession of her husband & her heirs forever.
 I give bequeath unto my daughter Sarah & her one bed of furniture
 I give bequeath unto my daughter Linda & her one negro boy named Mack & one bed of furniture now in the possession of her husband John Law to her & her heirs forever.
 I give bequeath unto my daughter Patience Jarver one negro girl named Peg & her increase & one bed of furniture to her & her heirs forever.
 I give bequeath unto my daughter Prue Jarver one feather bed of furniture & also land her one negro woman named Mall during her life & provided she marries I give the negro male but not her increase to her & her heirs forever.
 I leave unto my wife Elizabeth Jarver one negro man named Kelleford one negro woman named Daphny during her widowhood.
 My will & desire is that all that part of my Estate both real & personal which I have not disposed of be continued in the hand of my son John Jarver for the support of the brother until my youngest son comes to lawful age & then to be equally divided amongst my four Sons & it is also my will that the negroes Kelleford & Daphny which I have but unto my wife be equally divided amongst the Brothers when they come from her & the widow's part Mall & her increase be ^{equally} divided amongst the four Brothers. And I do hereby nominate & appoint my son John Jarver my whole sole Exor^s of this my last will & Testament In witness whereof I have signed sealed & declared in presence of,
