In witness I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Chappell
all my lands and plantation lying in this County on
Roanoke River as well as grounds as the plantation
wherein I now live they being two hundred acres at the day
of her entremarriage or the age of twenty one years
to her & her heirs forever but in case my said —
Daughter shall die without issue lawfully begotten
then give in that case I give all the before mentioned land
to my brother Drury Chappell and his heirs forever
I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Chappell
all the remainder and residue of my estate the sum of
what kind and what place looks like paying my just
debts and funeral expenses & further my will and desire
is that my loving wife have the use of the plantation
where I now live during her life or widowhood & no longer
Lastly I desire that my Executor may and set my said
soil ground & plantation as they shall then propose
for the advantage of my said wife Elizabeth
and the just distribution of the rest to be applied to her
Maintenance at the discretion of my said Executors
hereafter named

And lastly I do nominate & appoint my loving wife Elizabeth
and my brother John Chappell John Roper & Mr —
Drury Lee & Mr William Hall Executors to this
my last will & testament disannulling & making void
all other & former Wills by me made & this only to be
had & taken to be my true last Will
In witness whereof I have set my hand & seal

qualified Executors thereto which on the day was agreed

to the north of his land & the same land to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son James Vinton of Plantation wherun I now
dwell Containing one hundred of fifty acres of land lying between Snake
Swamp & Bear Swamp to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Susanah Morgan five ^{pieces} ~~shillings~~ Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my son David Vinton five shillings
Virginia Currency to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my son Peter Vinton six pounds Virginia Currency
to him & his heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Sarah Gutter five pounds Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give to my daughter Isabell Dashiell five pounds Virginia
Currency to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Charity Carter fifty acres
of land lying on the south side of Bear Swamp to her & her heirs forever.

Item I give & bequeath unto my well beloved wife Dorothy Vinton
all the rest of my estate my negroes & my riding horses & cattle
& the rest of my estate & belongings which I give her the use of them during her natural life.

and after her decease to be valued & the value equally divided
between all the aforementioned Children, and of this my last
will & Testament I make nominate & appoint to my trusty &
well beloved friends my son David Vinton, & James Vinton
my sole executors, reciting & naming all other ^{trustees} written
by me hitherto made, ratifying & confirming this & no other
to be my last will & testament, the witness whereof I have set
my hand seal.
