of twenty years also my will and desire is
that my son Peter should be Raised and Clothed
Out of my Estate by my son Elisha Webb I give
and bequeath unto my son Elisha Webb all the
rest of my Estate Real and personal after paying
all my Just debts and the before given Legacies to
