In the name of God Amen. I Philip Winborne of the County of Northampton & province of North Carolina being sick & weak of body, but of sound & disposing mind & memory Thanks be given to almighty God for the same, do make & ordain this my last will & testament in manner & form following That is to say first Principally I Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God that give it Fructifying to receive the same again at the last day with full & free pardon of all my sins thro' the Merits & Mediation of my blessed Lord & saviour Jesus Christ my body I ~~commit~~ ^{Commit} to the earth to be decently interred at the discretion of my Executors hereafter

named & as far such worldly goods & chattles as it hath pleased almighty God to bestow upon me & give over & bequeath the same as follows to wit.

Impunis I will that all my just debts & funeral Charges be ^{first} paid & discharged.

I Give & devise the quarter unto my dear beloved Wife Anne Winborne the use of two Negroes vizt, Coff & Sam, like as is one half of my moveable Estate during the Life & Adversary

I Give & devise the quarter unto my son Bryan Winborne my manor Plantation likewise one hundred acres of land adjoining the site that I have of William Harts, but I Give unto my grand son David Soncain one hundred acres of land adjoining to Sister Samuel puter Son & Alce Harts Lins. Also one bed & furniture. Out of the said Soncain I not live to the year of twenty one, the said hundred acres of my Plantation I give to my son, Bryan. The said of a nature to my Daughter Anne Winborne. Likewise I give my tract of land lying in the pine woods may be equally divided between my two sons Bryan Winborne & James Winborne. I likewise give unto my son Bryan after my wife decease my Negro Coff. Likewise give to my sons Bryan & James Winborne my Steel Cap & worms to them with their forever

I Give the quarter unto my son James Winborne the Plantation he now lives on, and one Negro girl named Doll this I leave to him his heirs forever.

I Give & devise the quarter unto my Daughter Mary one Negro Boy named Cesar, and after my wife has one half of my moveable Estate. I Give to Mary one half of the remainder to her three heirs forever.

I Give ^{my wife} the quarter unto my Daughter Anne Winborne after my wife decease the Negro woman Ann this in reversion & the other half of the moveable Estate to her three heirs forever.

I Give & devise the quarter unto David then born son of my Brother William Winborne twelve pounds proclamation money to be paid out of my moveable Estate before it is divided to him this his heirs forever.

I now give and bequeath unto my two daughters Mary and Anne the use of the small back room behind Stairs to them whilst they live single & no longer -

Lastly I do manfully constitute & appoint my trustees Bryant & James Whitcomb to be my lawful & legal Executors of this my last Will & Test and each hereby utterly revoking & disannulling all former & other Wills & Testaments whatsoever, heretofore made, ratifying, confirming this & none other to be my last Will & Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 11th day of May in the year of our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty Seven -

one negro boy named David to her & her heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Cobb
one negro girl named Liddy to her & her heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Stephen Cobb one negro
girl named Liddy to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Cobb one
negro girl named Fidd & one negro boy named
Dred to him & his heirs forever -

Item I give & bequeath unto my son Jesse Cobb one
negro girl named Rose to him & his heirs forever -

Item I leave my beloved Wife Mary Cobb the use of my
negro manch Bep & the negro manch Cate during
her widowhood & after her widowhood I give the
negro manch Bep & the negro manch Cate they & their
heirs to my son Abraham Cobb & my son John
Cobb & my daughter Pussilla Cobb & my daughter
Sarah Cobb to be equally divided between them and
any of them - And I do hereby appoint John
Deberry, Henry Deberry & Peter Deberry and
Abraham Starnson to divide the negro manch Bep
& my negro manch Cate they & their heirs equally be-
tween my son John Cobb & my son Abraham Cobb
