of Northampton & province of North Carolina being sick  
& weak of body, but of sound & disposing mind & memory  
Thanks be given to almighty God for the same, do make &  
rein this my last will & Testament in manner &  
form following that is to say first Principally I re-  
commend my soul into the hands of almighty God that  
you it trusting to receive the same again at the last  
day with full & free pardon of all my sins thru the merits  
& mediation of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ  
My body I commit to the Earth to be decently interred  
at the discretion of my Executors execution hereafter

named & so far such worldly goods & chattels as it hath  
pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me & given over &  
bequeath the same as follows etc.

Item I will that all my just debts funeral charges be paid  
& discharged.

Item I give over the same unto my wife Anne  
Wimberly the use of two Negroes vizt, Coff & Ann, likewise  
one half of my moveable Estate during the life of said Wimberly

Item Give & bequeath unto my son Bryan Wimberly my  
manor Plantation likewise one hundred acres of land  
adjoining the rest that I have of William Haffen, but  
I give unto my grand son David Sonciano one hundred  
acres of land adjoining to Doctor Samuel Peters house & lot about  
Lynn. Also one bed & furniture. But of the said Sonciano  
not less to the year of twenty one, the said hundred acres  
of my Plantation I give to my son Bryan & the bed & furniture  
to my Daughter Anne Wimberly. Likewise during my tract  
of land lying in the piny woods may be equally divided  
between my two sons Bryan Wimberly & James Wimberly  
Likewise give unto my son Bryan after my wife deceased  
my negro Coff Likewise give to my son Bryan & James  
Wimberly my Still Cap & worm tubs & their fixtures forever

Item I give bequeath unto my son James Wimberly the Plantation  
he now lies in and one Negro girl named Dell thereto  
added to him his heirs forever.

Item I give over the same unto my Daughter Mary one  
Negro boy named Caesar, and after my wife has one  
half of my moveable Estate I give to Mary one half of the  
remainder to her other heirs forever.

Item Give <sup>say</sup> bequeath unto my Daughter Anne Wimberly after  
my wife deceased the negro woman Ann thereto added &  
the other half of the moveable Estate to her other heirs forever.

Item Give over the same unto said John son of my Brother  
William Wimberly two hundred pounds proclamation money to be  
paid out of my moveable Estate before it is divided to him the heirs  
forever

done. give due to bequeath unto my two daughters Mary, and Anne the use of the somelast room below Stairs to them whilst they live single & no longer -

So silly I do nominate Constitute & appoint my two sons Bryant & James Wainborn to be my true & lawful Executors of this my last Will & Testamēt hereby utterly revoking & disannulling all former other Wills & Testaments whatsoever heretofore made, ratifying, confirming this & none other to be my last Will & Testament - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 11th day of May in the year of our Lord Christ One Thousand Seven Hundred & Sixty Seven -

Will I leave the use of during her MAJESTY'S time &  
after her MAJESTY'S time I give the negro man Will to my  
son John Cobb, and my negro man Jane, I leave the  
use of till my son John Cobb comes of age & after  
he comes of age I give the negro Jane to my son other  
Cobb, to him & his heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Jane Cobb one  
negro boy named Jacob, to her & her heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Cobb  
one negro boy named Nahid, to her & her heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Bass Cobb  
one negro girl named Sissi, to her & her heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Stephen Cobb one negro  
girl named Lucy to him & his heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Robert Cobb one  
negro girl named Fidd, and one negro boy named  
Dred to him & his heirs forever -

Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Ezra Cobb one  
negro girl named Rose to him & his heirs forever -

Item. I leave my beloved Wife Mary Cobb the use of my  
negro truck Bepp & the negro truck Cate during  
her MAJESTY'S time & after her MAJESTY'S time I give the  
negro truck Bepp & the negro truck Cate they & their  
heirs to my son Abelone Cobb & my son John Cobb  
& my daughter Priscilla Cobb & my daughter  
Sarah Cobb to be equally divided betwixt each and  
any of them - And I do hereby appoint John  
Deberry, Henry Deberry & Peter Deberry and  
Stephen Stonson to divide the negro truck Bepp  
& negro truck Cate they & their heirs equally be-  
tween my son John Cobb & my son Abelone Cobb
