William Winborne Will

Northampton County J. August 24th 1748.
 In the name of God Amen, I William Winborne of North
 ampton in Motherroland being at this time Sick &
 weak of body, but thanks be to Almighty God of
 sound perfect mind & memory, Calling to mind the
 uncertainty of this transitory life, & that all flesh must
 submit to death when it pleases God to call
 I therefore think fit to make this my last will &

Testament in manner & form following First, I give & give
 I give the Quaker ~~my~~ out unto the hands of God who gave
 it, hoping through the death & Resurrection of my blessed Lord &
 Saviour Jesus Christ to have, a full & perfect pardon of my
 sins, of all my sins, the inheritance everlasting life to come
 & my body to return to the earth from whence it was taken to
 be buried after a Christian like manner according to the
 direction of my Executors ~~hereafter~~ named & touching
 such worldly goods & Estate with back piece & God to
 bestow upon me & give, and dispose of in manner & form fol-
 lowing.

- Item* It is my will & mind that I am & give to any Person or
 Persons should be first satisfied Contented & paid within
 convenient time after my decease.
- Item* I give the Quaker unto my son William Winborne three fourths
 of a piece of land purchased by me of John Bapt. containing by
 Deed of one hundred fifty acres, & my will is that he
 shall have that part adjoining to Edward Campbell's
 & I give to my son William Winborne his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item* I give the Quaker to my son James Winborne the Plantation
 wherein I now live with the other half of the afore mention
 ed land by me before given to my son William, I say unto
 my son James Winborne his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item* I give unto my son Jose Winborne all that tract of
 land that I purchased of Jacob Bapt. containing one
 hundred acres more or less, I say unto my son Jose Winborne
 his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item* I give the Quaker unto my son Jose Winborne two saws &
 Calves & also my feather bed & furniture I say to my son
 Jose Winborne his heirs & assigns forever.
- Item* I give the Quaker unto my three Daughters Jane, Esther and
 Alice Winborne each of them ten pounds a piece
 Current money of Virginia, I say unto my three
 Daughters of or said thirteen & assigns forever.
- Item* My will & desire is that all my Lands in Virginia shall

be by my Executors sale & the profits that shall arise there from to be Cent, tribute Tax and paying of my last debts the surplus thereof to return to my Estate.

I give & give with all the remainder part of my Estate goods & chattels both real & personal unto my well beloved wife Anne Winborne during her natural life & after her decease to be equally divided among all my children

I nominate & appoint my loving wife Anne Winborne my two Brothers John & Phillips Winborne to be the whole Executors of this my last will & testament revoking & making vain all other former wills by me made.
