 in the State of N Carolina being very sick but yet in per-
 fect sound sense & memory. But nothing to maner that all
 flesh must die. I make this my last will & testament in
 manner and form as follows with first I recommend
 my soul to God that you it & my body to be buried in
 a decent Christian like manner casting my worldly
 estate which it hath pleased Almighty God to endue
 me with in the following manner.

- Item I give & bequeath to my Grandson John Raynolds 12 acres
 of land with the plantation whereon I now live and my slave
 to him to his heirs forever after my wife deceased
 Item I give & bequeath unto my son John Gay five shillings
 and no more.
 Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Martha Reynolds
 five shillings & no more.
 Item I give & bequeath to my daughter Mary Baker five shil-
 lings & no more.
 Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Prudence Gay
 all the remainder of my Estate in Doost two negro
 fellows Peter & Ben to be at her disposal.
 Item I give & bequeath to my Grandson Solomon Gay five shillings
 and no more.
 Item I give & bequeath to my Granddaughter Prudence Gay
 Eliza Gay five shillings cash & no more, & for other mon-
 ments & apparel Joseph Atherton George Barkley

Thomas Horn's Will
In the name of God Amen; the ninth day
of September 1775, I Thomas Horn of the
Province of New Hampshire County of Hampton
being very sick and weak in body but of
perfect mind and memory thanks be given
unto God. Therefore calling unto mind
the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men one to die
do make and ordain this my last will and
Testament as follows.

Principally and first of all I give and
recommend my soul into the hand of God
that give it and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executor
nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God and as touching such as —
worldly Estates wherewithal it has pleased God
to bless me with in this life, I give to my Son
and daughter of the same in the following
manner and form, First I give and bequeath
unto my Son James Horn the sum of ten
Shillings proclamation Money. Also I
give and bequeath unto my Son William
Horn the sum of ten Shillings proclamation
Money. Also I give and bequeath unto my
Son Joseph Horn the sum of ten
Shillings proclamation Money. Also I give
and bequeath unto my Daughter Tabitha
Farrar the sum of three pounds proclamation
Money. Also to my dearly beloved wife
Mary Horn I give & bequeath the land
whereon I now lie also part of a tract wherein
