 Estate which it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow
 on me with in the following manner.

Item I give bequeath to my Grandson John Raynolds 12 acres
 of land with the plantation whereon I now live and my share
 to him & his heirs forever after my other dearest

Item I give bequeath unto my son Jeph Gay five Shillings
 and no more.

Item I give bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Raynolds
 five Shillings & no more.

Item I give bequeath to my Daughter Mary Dike five Shil-
 lings & no more.

Item I give bequeath unto my loving wife Prudence Gay
 all the remainder of my Estate in Door & two negro
 fellows Peter & Ben to be at her disposal.

Item I give ^{bequeath} unto my Grandson Solomon Gay five Shillings
 and no more.

Item I give ^{bequeath} unto my Granddaughter Prudence Gay
 Eliza Gay five Shillings each & no more, & farther men-
 ioned appaint Jeph Atherton George Bankley

of September 1775 I Thomas Horn of the
Province of Maryland County of Warrington
being very Sick and weak in Body but of
perfect mind and memory thanks be given
unto God. Therefore calling unto mind
the mortality of my body and knowing
that it is appointed for all men once to die
do make and confirm this my last will and
Testament &c. viz.

Principally and first of all I give and
recommend my Soul into the hand of God
that gives it and my body I recommend to the
earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executor
nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall receive the same again by the mighty
Power of God and as touching such as
worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God
to bless me with in this life, I give demise
and dispose of the same in the following
manner and form, First I give and bequeath
unto my Son James Horn the sum of ten
Shillings of proclamation Money. Also I
give and bequeath unto my Son William
Horn the sum of ten Shillings of proclamation
Money. Also I give and bequeath unto my
Son Joseph Horn the sum of ten
Shillings of proclamation Money. Also I give
and bequeath unto my Daughter Sabitha
Leicester the sum of three pounds of proclamation
Money. Also to my dearly beloved Wife
Mary Horns I give & bequeath the land
whereon I now live also part of a tract known
