In the name of God amen I Charles Lupton of the County of South Carolina being of sound mind and memory, do hereby make and publish my last will and testament in the following manner and form, and first I hereby certify that all my lawful debts and charges be paid out of my estate, the residue and remainder of my estate I dispose of unto

Just I bequeath the lands and Plantations where as I now live, situate and possessed of and two Negroes, Dido and Lewis I bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Lupton to have the use of said Plantations and two Negroes during her natural life or so long as she shall give my beloved wife Mary Lupton my three Children Charles & Anne the first share of my Cows & Calves and two better Beds Furniture her share her two cows and two breeding does, and all my best Silver and Gold and my house also all my linen Casks and boxes such as I give to her and the wooden chest I use which two her Sons also the first choice of my Hogs and all my Cattle & the best of my Cattle which I have in my flock & the best of my Corn and of my estate to gather with my wife & Plantations & two Negroes Dido & Lewis I have to my son John Lupton at my decease and in case he should die I have to my daughter Mary except my wife should be a widow of a child after my decease I will that my son Jeremiah Lupton shall have my Negroes Dido & Lewis & the remainder of my estate and what is my wife to be equally divided between the above said Jeremiah & said child in case said child be born and legally I do appoint my beloved wife as executrix of my estate & my brother Henry Lupton Executor to this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 13th day of January in the Year of our Lord Christ One thousand Eight hundred & three

Leise Allen Will

In the name of God amen I Leise Allen of the County of Southampton and State of South Carolina being of sound mind and memory, thank be to almighty God, first therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body do constitute and Ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, First I commend my soul to God and my body to be buried in a decent shroud, form or manner and as touching all such Temporal Estate which has pleased God to bestow on me, I give and bequeath in manner and form following (to wit)

Item I Give to my grand son William Allen son of James Allen five shillings currency
Item I Give to my daughter Polly Jones five shillings currency
Item I Give to my son Henry Allen Ten pounds currency
Item I Give to my son Leise Allen the Plantation I now live on with two hundred Acres more or less, beginning at Rhodes Barclays line then running a line a long the east side of the Broad Bottom to James Ricks line to a corner pine I bequeath to him the said Leise Allen one feather Bed and Furniture and in his lot one better Dish than Plates
Item I Give to Elias Gay all the Remainder part of my Land to him and his heirs forever, I also give to the said Elias Gay two Cows and Calves
Item I Give to my Daughter Betty Allen one feather Bed and Furniture, one better Dish than Plates
Item I Give to my Daughter Nancy Allen one feather Bed and Furniture and in her lot one better Dish and two better Plates
Item The remaining part of all my property I bequeath to my wife Mary Allen during her natural life and after her death to be equally divided between Leise and Betty & Nancy my son and Daughters
Attest This is my will and desire that if my son Leise Allen dies without an heir that his part of my Estate be equally divided between Betty & Nancy my Daughters and I do constitute and appoint Elias Gay and John Davis to be my Executors of this my last will and Testament making void all other other Wills.
