

Burgess Bays Will

In the name of God Amen I Burgess Bay of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina; being in perfect tranquility of mind do make and devise this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Charlotte Bay's first Negro to wit, Nat, Emanuel, Lydia, Lucy and big Isaac, also and riding chaise, one rear Horse and one Gray Steer two feathered Hens and furniture, one large looking glass, and fifteen pounds Virginia money to be raised out of my estate to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath to the infant that my Wife is now pregnant with one Negro to wit, Bob, Aggy, Ann, Ned, little Isaac, Thomas, Betty, Sarah, & Richmond Living, provided the said infant arrives to the age of twenty one years, or has an heir of this body lawfully begotten, but if the said infant should fail to arrive to the age of twenty one years or have an heir of his or her body lawfully begotten my will and desire is that the legacy left the above named infant be equally divided between all the children of my Wife Elizabeth Little to them and their heirs forever.

Item my will and desire is that my land and plantation now in the use of my wife of what nature or kind ever (not already disposed of by my executors and the money from them arising to discharge my just debts, and the complex of any I give to the above mentioned infant, and Lastly I do devise and appoint my friends William Lykes and John Lykes Executors of this my last will and Testament revoking all other wills by me heretofore made

In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my Seal this 1st day of June 1793.

Drury Deberrys Will

In the name of God Amen I Drury Deberry of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God, do call to mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make and devise this my last will and Testament, principally and first of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God to give it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the direction of my executors hereafter named and in bequeathing such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with I give and dispose of in the form and manner following

Item I leave the use of all the lands and plantation lying on the Cobles branch and Kings creek to my supposed Daughter Charlotte Holman, until her son Thomas Deberry Holman comes to the age of twenty one years, and after Thomas Deberry Holman comes to the age of twenty one years, I give the said Land and plantation lying on the said Cobles branch & Kings Creek to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give to my supposed Grand son Thomas Deberry Holman all the Land and plantation wherewith I am here and still that stands on the Land to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and my will and desire is that Margaret Prindle should have all my Son Thomas Deberry's wearing cloaths

Item I give to my supposed Grand son Thomas Deberry Holman six Negroes known by the names of Jeff, Tom, Felix, Lewis, Lawrence and one woman by the name of Maria I give to him and his heirs forever

Item I give to my supposed Daughter Charlotte Holman ten Negroes known by the names of James, John, Champion, Ambrose, Brock, Sam, Hattley, Little, Linkey & Locke I give to her and her heirs forever
