

William Pennell's Last Will

In the name of God amen I William Pennell of Northampton County and State of North Carolina, being of sound and perfect mind and memory do this 18 day of November in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred and thirty one make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say —

First I bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Pennell during her lifetime one Negro Man named David one Negro Woman called old Polly, one Negro Woman named Fanny one Negro Woman named Jane one Negro Man named Bob one old Servant and one girl named also I bequeath to my said Wife all my stock of Horses Cattle Sheep & Hogs all my crop of corn, rice, all my House hold and Kitchen furniture with all the rest of the property I now possess both within and without doors except the property I shall hereafter give to my children, also I bequeath to my said Wife the use of all the Land and Plantations I now possess the above said property for the use of my said Wife Mary during her lifetime for her support in raising and bringing up my Daughter Mary Pennell. —

Secondly I give unto my Daughter Tabitha Allen the following slaves formerly put in her possession namely Joseph, Phoebe, Bob, Abner, & Abner these and their heirs forever to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever —

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my son David Pennell the following slaves formerly put in his possession namely Henry, Jack, Lizzy, Anne, & Jack these and their heirs forever to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever —

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rachel Shum as if dead of record in full capacity the following slaves namely Fanny, Jack, Penelope, Nelson, Lucy, & Jack these and their heirs forever to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever —

Fifthly I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Pennell the following slaves namely, Patsy, & Polly, Fanny, Sally, Anne, Bob, James, Louisa, Anne, Joseph, James, Abner, Abner, Anne, Anne, & Ed these and their heirs forever to have and to hold to them and their heirs forever —

also I give to my Daughter Mary Pennell, all the slaves and also also know Joseph himself as follows beginning at a fence in being Swamp Thence along a Running Line of marked trees between Joseph's plantation and myself to a White oak in Jack Pennell's Line thence along a Line of marked trees to a Cypress in the bottom Swamp thence up the River of our Swamp to the mouth of my Branch thence up said Branch to a Cypress then by a line of marked trees to a Cypress in Jack's Swamp thence by a line of marked trees to a fence in being Swamp thence down the River of being Swamp to the beginning containing by the line 523 Acres more or less to him and his heirs forever —

Sixthly My Will and desire is that if my Daughter Mary Pennell dies without lawful issue the slaves I give that come by my Wife Mary and her heirs should return to her father's family —

Seventhly My Will and desire is that all the rest of my property that my Wife Mary during her lifetime should have and to hold to her and her heirs forever become the property of my Daughter Mary Pennell for her and her heirs forever —

Lastly I nominate and appoint my Wife Mary Pennell and my Friend Charles Byrnes, Executors and Administrators to this my last Will and Testament the day and date above written —
