This day came before me Sophia Boon & Henry Boon & made oath that sundry times previous to the death of Nicholas Boon, they have heard him say, that owing to certain circumstances he wished to make a Will in favour of Elijah Gumb & Elias Boon that he intended to leave to each of them two Negro Boys (viz) Randolph & Hope. Witness our hands this 21st of October 1837

In the Name of God amica. I make this my last Will in Witness whereof the same has been read before me for the last of my life. It is to keep the other part of my land lying to my dear Home holding 3 acres & 1/2 of a parcel, I leave them to Edward holding my 1/2 part of estate. I leave them to be sold & the money equally divided between Thomas Mary Children & John & Annons Children. The money put out upon interest until they come of age or marriage my dear grounded Charity School & Church school & Potters. I leave them to my grand daughter Winna holding my last house & rug & blanket & counterpane & sheet & 1/2 a chair & 1/2 a part of a table & 1/2 a chair & 1/2 a young mare. I leave them to be sold & the money put out upon interest. I give them to my grand daughter Winna holding my hat my clock my shoes I give them to my daughter Henry Annons the residue of my estate to be equally divided between Henry Annons & Thomas Mary Children my dear dear. I leave them to my grand daughter Lucy Annons the money that I am owing to Thomas Wade is to be paid out of it & also my part of horse & sheep & I give them to Henry Annons, I leave Henry holding in witness. October the 10th day 1837
