In the name of God Amen I Peter Deberry of Northampton County in the province of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but of sound perfect mind and memory thanks be given to Almighty God do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament first I recommend my Soul to Almighty God in full hopes of His future happiness and my body to the earth to be decently entombed at the discretion of my executor hereafter named, my worldly estate I dispose of in manner and form following

- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abraham Deberry four Negroes namely Jack Cherry the one I have at home Miller Isaac and Abner, also I give unto my African's Son Abner fifty pounds Virginia Currency to be made out of my estate after my decease
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Deberry four Negroes namely Wonder, Will, Carry, London, and Tall after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Jenkins two Negroes namely Cherry & Abraham after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Deberry Jenkins two Negroes namely Cytha and Cherry after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Martha Jenkins two Negroes namely Sam & Oliver after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Mary Jenkins two Negroes namely Aggy & Carry after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Peter Jenkins one Negro boy Shem after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Ann Jenkins one Negro Girl Bester after my decease.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Peter Deberry the plantation whereon I now live containing three hundred acres after my decease, also I give unto my Son Peter the plantation whereon he now lives containing two hundred acres more or less.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Abraham Deberry another Negro boy named Sam after my decease.

Now Also I leave all the remainder part of my estate as here set out already mentioned to be equally divided between my two Sons Abraham Deberry & Peter Deberry after my decease. Also I appoint my two Sons Abraham Deberry and Peter Deberry my whole & sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament signed with my own Hand and Sealed with my Seal this 18th day of September in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety four.

Thomas Boon's Will

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Boon of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being well in health and of perfect mind and memory do hereby give and ordain this my last will and Testament disannulling and revoking all other will or wills heretofore made by me, I give my Soul to God that gave it me and my body to be buried after the discretion of my executor hereafter mentioned.

- Item I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Boon the use of my whole estate during her life time.
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Boon all my personal estate give to my Son John Boon four Negroes that is to say, Ben, Lucas, old shab and Ann, I also give my Son John Boon one sett of blacksmiths tools I also give my Son John Boon one feather bed & Quilt that is of skins I also give my Son John one third part of all my Hogs.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Felia Wood two Negroes that is to say one Negro man by the name of Sam and one Negro girl by the name of Susk to her and her heirs forever I bequeath my Daughter Felia two beds and furniture the bed she calls hers and the bed whereon I now lie I bequeath my Daughter Felia my Dress and Oval table and one Chest that she calls hers and one Day man and one Boys Cell by the name of Peace I bequeath to my Daughter Felia all the Cattle that she calls hers I bequeath to my Daughter Felia my largest Iron Pot and one Iron Kettle

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Patience Wood two Negroes one by name by the name of Lot and one girl by the name of Hannah to her and her heirs forever I bequeath my Daughter Patience Wood my Spring water Mill and my riding Horse and my Saddle and the remaining part of my white Cattle I bequeath to my Daughter Patience the bed and furniture whereon she doth lie and my Carpet and two Beds one Red and the other Blue and two square tables one Green and white and one Linn and all the hangings belonging thereto and one spinning wheel also one flax wheel a sign of my best chairs two Iron Stoves one white Iron and my best Flying Fan, my Head shill, and my Iron, my desire is that the remaining part of my estate after paying my debts may be equally divided between my two Daughters Felia Wood and Patience Wood, I do constitute and appoint Benjamin Sheppard Arthur Shumard and my Son John Wood to be the whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament to use the same purposes according to the intent thereof At Witness my Hand and Seal this 10th day of October in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and Eighty eight

Be it known that I Henry Augustine Wood of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind that its appointed for man once to die do make and give this to be my last Will and Testament that

Item I leave unto my Wife Elizabeth Wood the Lease and plantation whereon Lemuel Cotton now lives during her natural life

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Wood three Negroes Miany, Nancy & Wen to her and her heirs forever, also my Black Horse and single Chair two beds and furniture and a large looking glass

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Simeon Wood the following Negroes Cep, Luc, Stephen, Lias, Rachel, and Wend to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Peyton Wood one Negro called Harison to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Henry Wood the following Negroes Polipou, York, Lucy, Walter, Kate, Luke to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son James Wood the Lease and plantation that I purchased of Cotton whereon Leonard Halls now lives to him and his heirs forever. I also give devise and bequeath unto my Son James Wood the following Negroes Peter & Tartin to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Elisha Augustine Wood (after the death of his Mother Elizabeth Wood) the Lease and plantation whereon Lemuel Cotton now lives containing One hundred Fifty Acres more or less to him & his heirs forever

Item I leave unto my Wife Elizabeth Wood one Negro named Nancy during her natural life.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Son Elisha Augustine Wood the following Negroes Rachel, and Junny to him and his
