In the Name of God Amen William Boon of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being weak in Body this 21st day of March one thousand eight hundred and two being and calling to mind the Mortality of the body and knowing it is appointed for all Men and it is to make such a claim this my last Will and Testament in Manors and from following (w) after my last debt I give and bequeath to my dear Son James Boon all my land and one Negro Boy by the name of Luke one Horse called Bismarck my negro saddle and Bridle one Bed of Furniture and my last Barrow etc and twenty pounds in Money to him and his heirs forever.

I give I bequeath to my Daughter Sally Boon one Negro Saddle and bridle one feather Bed of Furniture to her the same I give I bequeath to my Daughter Sally Boon one Star Blanket one Clock one feather Bed of Furniture to her the same I have my Will and desire is that my Mother shall have a comfortable Support out of my Estate during her

Life, and the use of a Cow and calf while she continues at any place I have my Negro Woman Phillis to be hired out while my youngest Daughter comes of age or Marries after which time for her she be bound to be equally divided between my two Daughters also it is my Will and desire that all the remainder of my Estate be divided Equally divided between my two Daughters, to have their heirs forever. I do authorize and appoint my Loving Brother William, William Mearns, Arthur Thomas, & Benjamin Thomas, to be my lawful Executors to this my last Will and Testament, rendering all other Executors gone hence and authorizing this and as other to be my last Will and Testament, the Witness my hand and seal this twentieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and two.
