Eightly I Give all the remainder, First of my estate which is not before mentioned, to be equally divided amongst all my Children to have their Heirs or Assigns forever.

Witthly I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife, Charity, Legatee
and sole executrix ~~of~~ my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and
Testament, revoking all other will or wills made by me heretofore and giving this
and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this eighteenth day of
January in the year of our Lords one thousand seven hundred and eighty
one. —
