

William Burn's Will

In the name of God Amen I William Burn of Northampton County and State of North Carolina do make constitute and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament, in manner and form following

First

I give and bequeath to my son Barnaba Burn all my working Tools such as hand saws Chisels Hozes &c one Iron pot one Iron and furniture.

2<sup>d</sup> I give to my son William Burn one bed and furniture one Iron pot and one Tray Horse.

3<sup>d</sup> I give to my son in Law Silas Barker and Rose Burn one feather bed and furniture.

4<sup>th</sup> I give to my son James Burn one feather bed and furniture, along with a share of Estate after my wife decease, I leave to be equally divided between Barnaba & William and Silas. I give to my wife Elizabeth one Quarter Ditch or Water pipe about eight foms. Lastly I nominate Silas Barker and Barnaba Burn to be my executor to this my last Will & Testament hereby depending on them to truly and honestly fulfill the same. In Witness whereof I the said William Burn hath hereunto set my hand and Seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of October 1793

Thomas Bryan's Will

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Bryan of Northampton County being in a feeble state of health but of sound and disposing mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following

1<sup>st</sup>

I do give and bequeath unto Sarah Childs Council my two Plantations known by the name of Barkers place and Carvers place together with one half of my personal estate of every kind, I say to her and her heirs forever.

2<sup>nd</sup>

I give and bequeath unto Mary Council the Land and plantation whereon I live together with all the remaining part of my personal estate of every kind I say to her and her heirs forever.

My Will and desire is that if either of them should die before they come of age or without heirs the estate of the deceased is to return to the other both real and personal. - My Will and desire is that the Land lying in the fork of Wadeshaw & Gardner's creek known by the name of Abbeys place be sold in order to discharge my lawful debt. However my will and desire is that the Negro be retained upon the plantation under the care of a good woman in order to support the family and keep up the Stock and what remains more than a competent support is to be sold for the benefit of the Legatee, also my desire and earnest request to my Executor is that they will have the Children brought up by some good industrious woman, who will bring them up to industry and other qualifications suitable for families. - Lastly I do make and constitute Thomas Burn and William Bell Executor of this my last Will and Testament and that they shall have full power and authority to do as they think fit & most advantageous for the Legatee in respect to arriving with lawyers or having men qualified to do in any manner that may occur hereafter. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of November in the year of our Lord 1793.
