

# Kinchen Peterson's Will

In the name of God Amen I Kinchen Peterson of Northampton County & State of North Carolina being in my perfect sense and memory thanks be to God therefor, but calling to mind the mortality of my body both give and dispose my goods and chattels in manner and form following

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife two hundred the acres of land lying of hah-hole swamp in the County and State above mentioned and bounded as follows by Arthur Smiths line, Charles Gies, Nalls, Capelle, Papp, Shadons & Joseph Gies to the same more or less all my Negroes, Matt, Adam, Phillis, Amey, Nellie Cynthia Anne Mary & I kind carcass fowen, all my Stock of Horse Cattle, Hogs, Sheep fowen one riding Chair and gear seven feather bed & furniture all my Larders, chests, all my Tables and Chairs, looking glasses, all my fards, two wheel fire dogs, Gun, Deer, furbearer Chest, two bottles, hatbox, tools, trunks, cases, trunks, all my furs, fowen and fowden and the remaining part of my furs, of all kind, my furs, fowen and all the income of the fowen, all my Household and kitchen furniture, all my plantation utensils, all my Bonds, debts, dues and demands whatsoever and all the remains of my estate not herebefore mentioned to my beloved wife Anne Peterson to she and her heirs forever. And I do constitute make and ordain my wife Anne Peterson my only Executrix of this my last will and Testament by her freely to be proved and enjoyed, and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every former testaments, wills, legacies, requests and Executrix by me in any way before this time named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. # Robert Burgers's Will

In the name of God Amen I Robert Burger of Northampton County and State of North Carolina find myself in a very low state of health at present and it is my will and desire to leave my property in the following manner Right

Item I leave unto my dearly beloved wife Anne Burger the use of part of my plantation lying on the East side of the river branch beginning in the said branch with a straight line across the field just above the old Orchard where there now stands a crop fence to Isaac L. Sparbergs line thence along the said Sparbergs line into the swamp to the back line thence up the said swamp to the run of the said branch thence up the run of the said branch to the first station during her natural life and after her death I give and bequeath the said piece of land unto my son Matthias Burger to him and his heirs and assigns forever

Item I leave unto my dearly beloved wife Anne Burger all the House and Orchard and land on the West side of the said river branch until my son John Burger comes of age and then for the said land on the West side of the said branch to be equally divided between him and my wife and for my son John Burger to have the upper part of the said land.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Matthias Burger all the remainder of my land on the East side of the said river branch not herebefore given to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item

William I give & bequeath to my son John Burger after his mother Susan all my land on the west side of the back spring branch to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I leave the use of my pecora pasture called ~~Spring~~ <sup>Spring</sup> pasture unto my dearly beloved wife and my son Nathaniel Burger and John Burger and for them to leave it in good repair when my son Nathaniel Burger comes of age. I also leave the use of the remainder of my pecora land which is not under a fence unto my wife and my son John Burger until my son Nathaniel Burger comes of age and then I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Burger all my pecora land called ~~Spring~~ <sup>Spring</sup> pasture two hundred and six acres more or less to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Burger six hundred acres of land in Cumberland in the State of Georgia which I give my Executor lawful power to sell or swap the said lands for other land provided they think proper and if the Executor should sell the said land for them to purchase other land if they should have a convenient opportunity with the money they receive for the other said land to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Nathaniel Burger a Cow & two swine which has been called his also one bed furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Burger a Colt named Dolphin also one Cow & two swine & two chickens also one bed furniture to him his heirs and assigns forever and for none of the property to be sold.

Item I leave unto my dearly beloved wife the use of all the remainder of my property during her natural life and hereafter give and at her decease for my son John to have the Buffet bed now stands in the house and chest called ~~mine~~ <sup>mine</sup> and bed new stands in the house and chest called ~~mine~~ <sup>mine</sup> and my body cash and unto my son Nathaniel Burger at my wife's decease to have one bed furniture also one Cow & two chickens and at my wife Susan I give all the remainder of my property unto my daughter Mary Burger to her heirs and assigns forever. — And

And I further nominate and appoint my dearly beloved friends John Outland and William Outland as Executors of this my last Will and Testament whereunto I have set my hand and seal this the 23rd day of November in the year of our Lord 1798.

### Sampson Revill's Will

In the name of God Amen I Sampson Revill of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina being at present in perfect health of body and of good and sound memory thanks be to God and calling to mind the mortality of my body do give and bequeath my goods and chattels in manner here following to wit: My will and desire is that all my just debts should be paid out of my estate.

Second. Item I leave unto my loving wife Margaret Revill during her natural life the land and plantation whereon I now live also all my household and kitchen furniture likewise all my stock of Cattle Hogs, Horses and Sheep after the death of my loving wife I give unto my son Sampson Revill the land & plantation whereon I now live that is to say one hundred acres, second I give unto my son Matthew Revill the land and plantation whereon he now lives that is to say one hundred acres, if there is more land then each part in Land I desire that the balance may be divided between my two sons Sampson & Matthew. Third I give unto my son Matthew all my Carpenter tools also I give to my two sons my hand mill and crop cut saw to Matthew & Sampson.
