

Miss Collier's Will

In the name of God amen I Miss Collier of Northampton County in North Carolina being of a sound mind and memory thanks be to almighty God for the same and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die this 18th day of May in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety three make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows first I recommend my soul to almighty God hoping through the merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ that he will vouch safely to receive it and my body to the grave to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter mentioned, and for what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow on this my body in this life I dispose of in manner I give as follows

- Item first I will that my debts be paid.
- Item I do lend to my wife Susannah Collier my land and plantation until her death or marriage.
- Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Collier and her issue which is called the said Nancy Collier
- Item I do lend to my wife Susannah Collier five Negroes and their increase Reba Malinda, Shady, Harry & George until my son Jonathan Collier arrives to the age of twenty one years or my wife's death or marriage with all the remainder part of my estate until his death or marriage or my son Jonathan Collier comes of age or that term of time.
- Item My Will is at my wife's Susannah Collier's death or marriage or when my son Jonathan Collier comes to the age of twenty one years or that term of time for all these five Negroes and their increase and all the remainder part of my estate excepting my land to be sold and the money equally divided between my wife if not married and my six children, Nancy Collier, Green Collier, James Collier, Sarah Collier, Jane Collier & Jonathan Collier or their heirs, but if my wife marry before my son Jonathan Collier comes to the age of twenty one years old my will is for it to be equally divided between my six children just above named only, if not for her to have an equal part with these six children.
- Item My will is at my wife's Susannah Collier's death or marriage for my land to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my three sons, Green Collier, James Collier & Jonathan Collier
- And Lastly I do appoint and ordain Joshua Collier, William Horton, and William Rowen my whole and sole Executors of this my

William Ricks's Will

In the name of God amen. William Ricks of Northampton County in North Carolina being at this time very weak in body and of sound mind and memory thanks be to God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die as for all the worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow on me in the following manner and form.

- Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Futral five shillings to her when she comes of age
- Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Futral five shillings to her when she comes of age
- Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Son James Ricks five shillings to him when he comes of age
- Item I give and bequeath to my Grand Daughter Nancy Futral five shillings to her and her heirs forever
- Item I give bequeath to my son William Ricks five shillings to him when he comes of age
- Item I give bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Anne five shillings to her when she comes of age
- Item I give bequeath to my son Sampson Ricks five shillings to him when he comes of age
- Item I give bequeath to my Daughter Susannah Colson five shillings to her when she comes of age
- Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Indian Ricks fifty acres of land to wit beginning at a place in Strawberrys old field then a South line to Meantins road then up the said road to a place then a line of marked trees to the first station being fifty acres more or less to my Grand Son and his heirs forever
- Item I give and bequeath unto my son David Ricks three Negroes to wit Shady, Harry and Rachel also one Sack and folding table one Cow of black and red
