James Cotton's Will

State of North Carolina
Nottingham County. I James Cotton of the State of North Carolina
of sound long aged and infirm of body though of a sound and
disposing mind and memory and calling to mind that by God it
is ordained for man to die do make this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following after

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Dickinson Cotton my land
and plantation lying and being in the Bear Meadow also
the land and plantation wherein I now live, the lands and
plantation I bought of Charles Taylor also a Tract of Land
I bought of Peter McDaniel lying and being in the Rudy
River, all of them three last mentioned plantations or tract
of land my wife life time excepted and for her to have
the use and benefit during her natural life, also I give and
bequeath unto my Son Dickinson Cotton six negroes vizt
Aaron, Rose, Dennis, Ellick, great Aunt Fannie and her
successors, and Lucy remain from this time also three
Horses vizt The white Mare, Tickled fisher, and the
Hyder Alley filly, six Cow Heifers, two Sheep & pigs too
yoke Oxen, etc! the old York belonging to the Meadow together
with the best Wakas belonging to them and the young York
five head of Sheep, my slave have buckle & spurs, my Coffey
Shele and her man which is on the plantation in the meadow
also all the plantation utensils belonging to the plantation in the
meadow, also my large Steel traps, also after my wife decease
I give unto my Son Dickinson Cotton my son's title, my wife
and devise is that my Son Dickinson Cotton shall yearly
furnish my wife with fifty bushels of sound Indian corn
to be delivered her at the plantation in the meadow and
for him my Son Dickinson Cotton his Hairs and
spikes to have and enjoy forever.

all her and furniture and all else, also Give Bequeath unto
my Daughter Polly Cotten the Land and plantation bought

lying on the North side of Cuttywhisker swamp and adjoining
Peter A. Daniels land and two new Hedges on said
plantation to her sole her Heirs forever.

Give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Cotten
Two Negroes Mr. Ned, Charles, Tom, Jerry & Little Jack
also Land to my wife Elizabeth Cotten the use of all my
Lands except my Land in the Meadow during her natural
life, also Give to my wife Elizabeth Cotten three head of
Horses &c & the bay Horse called Peterson, the bay Mare
One bay Horse call I bought at Bridges Sale ten years ago
and Spring, eighteen head of cattle, One yoke Oxen which
I bought of Shady Parker and the Cart and wheel which
are at home, fifteen head of Sheep, Six score Hedges and
all the remaining part of my Stock of Hogs about home
My will and desire is that all the rest of my estate not
already given away consisting of Goods Notes & other amounts
be equally divided between my beloved wife Elizabeth
Cotten my son Dickinson Cotten and my Daughter Polly
Cotten; My will and desire is that my Ayder Ally Horse
Cott be sold, my large Slave Wm. Hill sold and the
remainder part of my cattle not already given away
Give all the remainder part of my estate not already given
away consisting of the portable property to my beloved
wife Elizabeth Cotten to her and her Heirs forever. My
will and desire is that all the money owing from the sale
of the property left to be sold be equally divided between
my wife, my son Dickinson Cotten & Daughter Polly Cotten
