

Edward Davis Will

In the name of God amen I Edward Davis of a town Anthon
County and State of North Carolina being in perfect health, sound mind &
memory thank be to God for the same but calling to mind the Mortality
of my body do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner
and form as followeth (viz)

I Give unto my beloved son John Davis ten shillings to him the Heirs
I Give unto my beloved son Edward Davis the Land plantation whereon
he now lives, to him and his heirs for ever
I Give unto my Daughter Mary Dyer ten shillings to her & her Heirs
I Give unto my son Joseph Davis ten shillings to him the Heir —
I Give unto my Daughter Sarah Davis One Leather Bed and Furniture
One Cow the Calf six plates One feather Bed and Furniture
to her and her Heirs for ever
I Give my son Arthur Davis the land and plantation whereon he now
lives to him and his heirs forever
I Give unto my son Samuel Davis the plantation and Land lying
on the Wild Cat swamp below my son Edward Davis plantation also
One small house One Cow and Calf Six plates One Dish One Spoon
also One Leather Bed and Furniture to him & his Heirs forever
I Give unto my Daughter Lucy Davis on Leather Bed and Furniture one
Cow and Calf six plates One Dish One Spoon to her & her Heirs forever
I Give I give unto my son Samuel Davis the Land and plantation where
on Lucy lives after the Death of my wife I Give unto my son Samuel
One Leather Bed and Furniture Six plates One Spoon one Dish also one Cow
and Calf to him and his Heirs —
I Give unto my beloved wife Sarah Davis the rest of the Land and plantation
where on I now live during her widowhood also all the rest of my Estate
with in doors and with out but at Death or Marriage I Give the same to
be equally divided amongst all my Sons & Daughters
I do nominate and appoint my beloved son Arthur Davis my sole and
sole Executor of this my last will and Testament revoking nothing said either
written here to fore made by me in Writing before them at my hand there
this 2nd February 1796 — — — — —

Nathaniel Harrison Will

In the name of God amen Nathaniel Harrison of the County of
Northampton and State of North Carolina being in despoil of Body but
of sound and disposing mind and memory make this my Last will
and Testament in manner and form following first first my soul
to Almighty God who gave it me & my body to be Buried in Christian like
manner at the discretion of my Executors —

It is my will and desire that my Negroe Woman Anna Wynn should have
her Freedom and as I know that this part of my will cannot take
effect without inter prance of the Legislature in favour of the
said Negroe Woman I pray them to pass an act for her Liberation
and in case the Legislature should not grant the above Request of
Liberation then in that case I give the said Negroe Anna to James
Bradley of Halifax County in full confidence that he will give
her all the Indulgence that she has merited

I Give to my friend Robert Potts his Heirs & Spigars for ever One Bay
Horse call'd Buck One Two year old mare gotten by Alderman also
my Stock of Horses no other wise disposed of also all my Stock of Cattle
I give the said Robert the One half of the Money due and on the
Stock of Thomas H. Penfield and Benjamin Taylor to receive when collected
& all my furniture not otherwise disposed of
I Give to my Friend Tom Potts his Heirs and Spigars for ever my Back
Wife and her father Ed. and his wife

I Give to my Son John Copell Two Cows to be chosen by said Copell from
all my Stock of Cattle —

I Give to Richard Cleare Two cows second choice of my cattle —

I Give to my Friend James Bradley of Halifax County to him his Heirs &
Spigars forever the Four Hollowing Negroes To my Mary and George Two
Young Children not yet named — One Bay Horse Three Two and three
half years old Breeding mare & Fifteen sheats I also give to the said Bradley the half
of the Cow now in my plantation —

I Give to the above named James Bradley his Heirs and Spigars all the remainder
and remand of my Estate both real & personal forever & Lastly I nominate
and appoint my Friends Job Bradley & Robert Potts Esq. to this my Court
will & Testament making and all other wills by me hereafter made in Writing
which I have made set my hand & seal his Twenty First day of March 1803
