disposal of my property that I have placed God to intercede in me in the following
manner.

My Friends I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth Willard the sum of
fifty pounds. —

Next. Give and bequeath unto my Sister Mary Lee Willard the sum of
fifty pounds. —

Item. I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Martha Willard all the rest and residue
of my estate, and real & personal to her and her Heirs and assigns forever, also
I hereby nominate my living Sister Martha Willard my sole Executrix
of this my last Will and Testament this 22nd November 1789 —

Brittian Long's Will


In the name of God amen. I Brittan Long deceased say much.

our Master here do make and ordain this my Last Will and Testament
as follows and prove following. —

My Friends I Give and bequeath my Seal to god who gives it me witness to the
words of our Lord Jesus Christ to have I recd. at the execution
of the just and my body to be decently buried by my Executors before
me and to my worldly goods I Give and dispose of in the manner
and prove following. —

Item. I Give and bequeath to my dear and loving Wife my whole and sole
estate, real and personal whatever the same may be and in whatever
the same may be to her and her Heirs forever. —

And I ordain and constitute my dear and loving wife my whole
and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament. —
Witness where I have inserted my Name and affixing my
