In the name of God Amen I Henry Williard of Middlebury County
and State of North Carolina finding myself afflicted with a bad cold do think proper
to dispose of my property that it shall please God I entered in in the following
manner.

Impremis I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Elizabeth Williard the sum of
fifty pounds.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Mary Ann Williard the sum of
fifty pounds.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my Sister Martha Williard all the rest and residue
of my stock, real and personal to her and her Heirs and assigns forever, and do
thereby nominate my loving Sister Martha Williard my sole executrix
of this my last Will and Testament this 20th December 1789.

William Long's Will

In the name of God Amen William Long being sick and
dying do of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of
our abiding here, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
in manner and form following.

Impremis I Give and bequeath my Soul to God who gave it me, wishing in the
words of our Lord Jesus Christ to have it restored, let the resurrection
of the just and my body to be shortly buried by my Executors hereafter
named, and to my worldly goods I Give and dispose of in the manner
and form following.

Item I Give and bequeath to my dear and loving Wife my whole and sole
Estate, real and personal wherever the same may be and in whatever
the same may be to her and her Heirs forever.

And I ordain and constitute my dear and loving wife my whole
and sole executrix of this my last Will and Testament.

Witnessed I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my
Seal this 18th day of December in the year of our Lord 1778.
