In the Name of God Amen I Francis Dolys of Northampton County late of Northampton living of Ripon Murray D.C. be god. and being to mind my Mortality make this my last Will and Testimonye following —
 Give to my beloved wife Sarah Dolys living Estate both me and Russell, after paying my just debts to her and unto my daughter Abigail Dolys Maries a sum of age, at what time there shall be a Division between my self & self & Daughter Abigail Dolys as follows —
 & Daughter Abigail Dolys a sum of age, with their Sonnes, namely Thomas, Easter, Major, & Elizam, also along board and stoke of all kind with household & Kitchen furniture shall be equally divided between them both, and my daughter Abigail Dolys shall have the use of the one half of the said Estate where during her natural life, but if she dies without any lawful heir the same is to return back to my loving wife Sarah Dolys the survivor — But if my said Daughter Abigail Dolys should at her death leave her a heire lawfully begotten of this Body the half of my Estate which she is to have the use of from the time of her death during her natural life given and bequeathed to her and her heire forever, and as long as my Estate to my loving wife Sarah Dolys with my Daugher Abigail Dolys Maries a sum of age, she my said loving wife Sarah Dolys for the use of the whole to keep a gently Maintaine her and Daughters until such time the above provision is made —

Northampton County Her Will and desire was that all of her Estate should go to the equally divided between her son Elizam Purvis, and her Brother Miles Purvis independent, she in fear of all the wants of her Relations — Memphis Byrnes who being duly sworn did before me that on the Tuesday before the Saturday night, or Friday morning before she die, said that she asked the said Miles Purvis if she thought she would die the same time she did she shant, and she replied I wish for her Property to go to Sally Miles Purvis, & requested her to take Notice of it, and that she did not want any of the rest to have a Parting of it committed to writing this 17 April 1805 and witness to before me Mary Purvis Wm
