Item. Give and Bequeath unto my Son William Lewis one hundred acres of Land being the plantation wherein he now doth live to him and his Heirs forever. I give unto my Son Benjamin Lewis one Cow and Calf to him and his Heirs forever. All the rest of my estate that I have not given away I desire shall be sold and after my debts being paid I desire it shall be divided between William Lewis, Benjamin Lewis, Sarah Lewis, Patience Griggs, and Fanny Howlett, also I do make and appoint my Son James Lewis my sole executor of this my last will and Testament, and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former testament, Will, legacies, legatees and executors by me in any way before named, willed and bequeathed satisfying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 29<sup>th</sup> of October 1789. —

In the name of God Amen I Bethell Ellis of the County of Northampton being sick and weak of body but thanks be to God of sound mind and memory do ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit.

I send the use of all my Land which I possess which is by estimation one hundred acres to my wife Martha Ellis during of her life or widowhood, and at her death or marriage which ever should first happen then give the said Land back as above mentioned to my son Bartholomew Ellis, to him and his Heirs and assigns forever.

Item I leave to my wife Martha Ellis the bed and furniture my share and half her choice of my Lear and six sheets and three of my large bags, my snare pot, one flat dish two basins half dozen plates half a dozen Spoons, half a dozen knives and forks, one plough hook and walking stick, one setting box, one Ace, four setting chairs, one spinning wheel, and fands, and all my Books during her life or widowhood, and at her death or marriage and then the estate so left to be equally divided between all my children.

Item I give to my son in law James Wilson, one year old colt to him and his Heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that all the rest and residue of my estate except my old saddle be sold by my executor hereafter named and the money arising therefrom for the payment of my debts and then the saddle excepted, for the use of my wife and family.

And Lastly I do hereby appoint my friends Charles Adlair and Henry Newham just my executors to this my last will and Testament revoking all former wills heretofore by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this 25<sup>th</sup> of August 1794.
