

Thomas Furbills Will

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Furbill of Northampton County being of sound and perfect mind and memory do hereby be-
 God do this 22nd day of October in the year of our Lord 1796 make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say first I recommend my Soul to God who gave it.

Item I give to my beloved Son Shadrach Furbill one Negro Girl named to him and his Heirs forever.

I and my plantation whereon I now live to my beloved wife Sarah Furbill during her life also one Negro woman named Sally during her natural life and after her death my plantation I give to my Son Thomas Furbill and his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my Son Thomas Furbill one Negro boy named to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give to my beloved Son John Furbill a tract of land containing one hundred acres that I bought of Joel Furbill to him and his Heirs forever also one Negro girl named Jane to him the said John Furbill and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Charity Furbill one bed and bolster and one chest to her and her Heirs forever.

Item I give to my Daughter Patsy Furbill one bed bolster to her and her Heirs forever, and all the remainder of my estate which I have not given away to be sold and equally divided between my Daughters Bathsheba Holston, Patsy James, Charity Furbill, Patsy Furbill, Amy Furbill, Rebecca Furbill, Elizabeth Furbill, & Clarissa Furbill to them and their Heirs forever also I give to my Daughter Bathsheba Holston four Glen Dollars, also I give to my youngest Daughter Clarissa twenty pounds Virginia Money, also I give to my youngest Son Thomas Furbill twenty pounds Virginia money in cash exclusive of what I have already

before given them and at the death of my beloved wife the negro woman Sally to be sold and equally divided amongst all my Children I do hereby Ordain and appoint my Son Shadrach Furbill my Executor of this my last Will and Testament I the said Thomas Furbill have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written.

The nuncupative Will of Robert Jones dec'd
 Northampton County pt.

Harriet Pottle & Robert Pottle being duly sworn on the Solemn Oath do declare that on the 27th of August Robert Jones in being then in his perfect sense called on them to take notice that he made his last Will as follows viz. He gave \$1000 and his family Martin, Tom and his family and all the rest of the Negroes to his wife Harriet during her life and devised his stock and plantation to be sold and after paying his debts he gave the balance remaining to his wife, and requested that James Brasley & Allen Jones should manage his affairs.

The above Deposition & Declaration taken before us this 30th of December 1795.
