I Hannah Garrison of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound mind & memory & in my perfect senses calling to mind such debts as I think as belongs to me do wish and desire that all my just debts be paid and discharged by my Executor hereafter named. I give and bequeath to my beloved mother Abel Garrison all my property of every kind to her & her heirs forever I hereby make void all other Wills and appoint this to be my Last Will and Testament and do nominate my friend Ethelred Martin, Executor, & Comptroller to this my Last Will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Eleventh day of November 1800

Willis Bridges Will

In the name of God, Amen I Willis Bridges of the County of Northampton being poorly but of perfect mind and Memory do make and appoint this to be my last will and Testament (My) first I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who give it, and my Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner and as to what worldly goods God hath pleased good to bestow on me, I give and Dispose of in manner and form following

I give to my nephew William Bridges son of John Bridges my part of the Tract of land lying at the ferry that is now in possession of the said William Bridges to him & his heirs forever.

I give to my niece Polly Bridges one feather Bed and furniture. My will and Desire is that the Tract of Land when I formerly lived by the name of the Golden Gract be sold and the balance of my property my just Debts paid the balance to be equally divided between my Nephews & Nieces that is to say, Polly Bridges, Bernard Bridges, Hannah Bridges, My Sister Temperance Bridges, children & my Sister Mary's children to them & their heirs forever.

I give to my brother William Bridges Children ten Shillings a piece, I likewise constitute William Bridges and also Jonas Quench Executors of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 22 day of June 1802
