I give and bequeath to my beloved mother Isabell Garrison all my property of every kind to her & her heirs forever I hereby make void all other Wills and appoint this to be my last Will and Testament and do nominate my friend Christopher Martin Esquire & Executor to this my last Will. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Eleventh day of November 1800

# Willis Bridges Will

In the name of God amen I Willis Bridges of the County of Newington being partly but of perfect Mind and Memory do make and appoint this to be my last will and Testament (viz) just I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it, and my Body to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner and as to what worldly Goods it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give and Dispose of in Manner and form following

Item I give to my nephew Stephen William Bridges son of John Bridges my part of the Tract of Land lying at the Ferry that is now in possession of the said William Bridges to him & his heirs forever

Item I give to my niece Polly Bridges and feather Bed and furniture My Will and Desiring that the Tract of Land where I formerly lived by the name of the Golden Fleece be & is and the balance of my property My Just Distr'p'n & the balance to be equally divided between my nephews & nieces that is to say Polly Bridges, Barnes Bridges, Maria Bridges My sister Temperance Bridges children & my sister Rosy's children to them & their Heirs for ever

Item I give to my brother William Bridges Children ten Shillings a piece Likewise Constitute William Bridges and Mrs. Josias Cram Prover of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and affixed my seal this 10 Day of June 1803 — Willis Bridges Esq
