 five Hundred Dollars to her & her Heirs & assigns.

Plantation Wares &c. & the Crop of all kinds which may be on the plantation at the time of my Death

supported & Educated out of the profits of said Estate untill my wife Nancy untill he
arrives to the age of Twenty one
Item I give & bequeath unto my Son Adams Gifford to him & his heirs forever four of my best & best
Negro Slaves; the said four to be chosen by Executors hereafter named when ever my
wife Nancy may marry or before this time or when my Son Adams arrives to the age of
Twenty one years, — Also I give my Executors full power at either of those periods to chose
in my son Adams as much of the stock of all kinds, Household & Kitchen furniture, Plantation
Wares, Grains &c. to the best or reason to be sufficient for my son Adams. — I
also give my Executors full power should my wife Nancy die first before untill my Son
Adams arrives to the age of Twenty one year able to choose a Sufficiency of Stock of all kinds,
Household & Kitchen Furniture, Plantation Wares, Grains &c. sufficient for house, &c.
Also my will is that after my Son Adams arrives to the age of Twenty one years
that my wife Nancy Gifford his mother be satisfied her full weight of the charges out of
what property I have already Given & may hereafter receive any my Son Adams
give & bequeath to my Son Adams Gifford the plantation including all the Lands &
appurtenances thereto belonging in which I now live, to him & his heirs forever having one
Oathman should my Son Adams depart this life before he arrives to the age of Twenty one
years or die without a lawful issue, then it is my will the whole Inheritance to him
