on a 100 Shares and my Sister Barrett and Elizabeth and
Prudence Barrett. Now Give & bequeath unto my Daughter
Mary Hawley one 100 Acres furniture Give & bequeath unto my
Grand child Charlotte Kinsman her Father's furniture Money to be
paid out of my Estate Give & bequeath unto my Daughter
Cecilia Kinsman and to my Daughter Mary Hawley all the Stock
of my Estate in cows and and does to be equally divided between
them I do hereby make and declare my dear William Hawley my first Executor
and John Colson my second Executor to this my last Will and
Testament Give and bequeath my land and here I have offered my last
this 1st day of July and therefore I have hereunto set my hand

do hereby make and declare this my last Will and Testament in
the following Manner and Form. First Give & bequeath to my dear
Daughter Elizabeth Sawrey all my land on the South side of Kings
River and all my right & title
and help of my Wife or said Wife also all my right & title
to the land whereon William Sawrey now lives and the following
Negroes (Slaves) Maria, Anne, Sarah, Jacob, Robt, Lewis,
Chas, Barrett, Mary, Sam, Miles, and Mary in case my said
grand daughter dies leaving no issue of her body my Wife and
mine is that the aforementioned property should be my grand
Daughter Jane Jane Long. Now Give & bequeath to my
grand Daughter Jane Jane Long the land of 100 Acres
whereon I now live lying on the North side of Kings River
also the other half of my Wife or said Wife and the following
Negroes (Slaves) Maria, Anne, Sarah, Robt, Charles, and
my, Jack, Moses, William, Matthew, Sarah, and to him, Anne,
my said grand daughter mentioned in this Will and leaving
no issue of her body then the property mentioned in this Will
shall be divided to my grand daughter Elizabeth Sawrey, to wit
with my grand daughter Elizabeth Sawrey and Jane Jane Long
should die without issue of their bodies then the property of said
William to divide as follows, all my land to be sold and the
following Negroes 1. to be sold also Charles, Maria, Anne,
Charles, Anthony, Jack, Mary, Robert, Sarah, and Sam, Anne,
Thomas, Anne, Sarah, Mark, with their increase and the whole
amount of said 100 to be equally divided among the following
persons. The Wife of Henry Sawrey and of Robert Barrett, of
Mary Barrett, and of John Barrett (deceased) and the following
Negroes Sam, Matthew, Sarah, Mary, Barrett, Mary, Miles, Mary,
and Lewis with their increase to be equally divided between
the Wife of Thomas Williams, to wit of my last wife Jane
then Give & bequeath to my Anne Sarah Barrett one 100
and furniture also two hundred Dollars to be paid by
my Executor after I have sold my property and a bill of sale
