 is then my Will that all my Estate to be equally divided
 between all my Legates except my Land which I give to my beloved
 Son, William Sumner & John Sumner also if my Wife & I die that
 my Executors sell a fourth of my Stock on Will & distribute among my children
 I would & ordain appoint my truly friend Wm. W. who
 & his Executors after this my last Will & Testament do recanting
 & revoking all others in Writings I have set my Land
 the 15th day of October in the year 1808

 I give I bequeath to my Cousin William Horne one half of all my
 Estate which is not yett given away both of my negroes & all other property by him
 freely to be possessed & enjoyed for ever
 All the remainder of my whole Estate which is not yett given away I give I bequeath
 to my Brother Joseph Horne & Sams Horne my Cousin & his heirs
 to be equally divided amongst them each one shall take by them self
 to be possessed and enjoyed forever
 Furthermore I do hereby make & ordain my say Brother Joseph Horne
 & Cousin William Horne of Boston County my whole sole Executors of this my
 Last Will & Testament in Writing whereof I the said William Horne
 have set my hand & seal the day & Year above
 Signed Sealed Published & attested
 by the said William Horne the
 Testator as this last Will & Testament
 in the presence of us who were present
 at the time of making of this will
