In the name of God AMEN I Henry Howell Senior
of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in a low state of
Health at present but thanks be to God for it is proper sound since
and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
in manner and form as followeth & theye

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Deborah Howell my leather
bed and furniture one Goat one Cow and one Calf and one
negro woman named Sallie to her and her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son John Howell all the remainder
part of my Cattle and also all my Horses Hogs and Sheep with
all other working Tools on the plantation, and also give him my
said son John Howell the plantation and Land wherein he may
with all my household and plantation furniture consisting of
Beds, Painter, Potts, and all other necessaries in doors and
out doors to him and his heirs forever, also give unto said John
Howell one Hundred acres of land lying on the dividing branch
in the said County to him and his heirs forever, and I
further desire that after my decease that the remainder part
of my Negroe, after my just debts are settled should be sold
and equally divided between my children namely Arthur
Howell, Deborah Howell, Celia Smith, Elizabeth Howell
Elizabeth Lester, Henry Howell, Benjamin Howell,
John Howell, to them and their heirs forever, disannulling
all other will or wills, abrogating this and this only
to be my last Will and Testament, this 27th day of
April in the year of our Lord Christ 1794 to the person
of the subscriber witness; I also appoint my Son John
Howell my whole and sole executor to this my last Will and
Testament.

At all my just debts is to be paid out of the
goods Sealed and delivered by me that my negroes will for
the presence of us

County and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and
memory do make and ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament to wit —

I give and bequeath unto my Grand Daughter Nancy Peeler Elliott to
her and her heirs forever my negro woman Sall and her four
children namely Tom, Luke, Aggy, Abram, & Henry.

I direct that my negro woman Nancy and her children
should be sold to the highest bidder, and the money arising
from the sale thereof I give and devise unto my two Grand
Daughters Mary & Nancy Whetstone to be equally divided
between them Also give and devise unto my said Grand
Daughter Mary and Nancy Whetstone all the remainder &
residue of my estate to be equally divided between them.

Lastly I do nominate and appoint my son in law Richard
Whetstone Executor of this my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
Seal this 14th day of June 1794 Dated 1794.
