

Emmey Jenkins's Will

In the name of God Amen I Emmey Jenkins of Northampton County, State of North Carolina, being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory of mind, and calling to mind the mortality of my body and that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son William Jenkins five shillings specie to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my Son Bryan in Jenkins five shillings specie to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my Grand son Charles Estlin five shillings specie I being what I intended for his Mother to him this Will forever.

Item I give bequeath unto my Grand son Mathew Barker five shillings specie to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and devise in that all the rest of my free body of every kind to be equally divided between my Daughters Mary Stephenson Charity Barker my Grand son David Barker and my Grand son Isaac Richards to them and their heirs forever. And I constitute and appoint my Son William Jenkins my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking and annulling all others As Witness my Hand and Seal this 1st day of December 1796.

To Rebecca Webb Margaret Webb Nancy Webb and Sarah Lee I give all the property I now have or may hereafter be possessed of to be equally divided amongst them.

Secondly I do hereby nominate and appoint John and Thomas Webb sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament As Witness my Hand and Seal this 28th day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety seven.
