

## Emmy Jenkins's Will

In the name of God Amen I Emmy Jenkins of Northampton County Estate of North border being sick and weak a body full of infirmities and memory of mind and calling to mind the mortality of my body and soul that it is appropriate for all men now to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. That

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Nathan Jenkins five shillings specie to him and his wife forever.

Item I give Bequeath unto my Son Bryan Jenkins five shillings specie to him and his wife forever.

Item I give Bequeath unto my Grandson Charles Odum five shillings specie of being what I intended for his mother when this Will forever.

Item I give Bequeath unto my Grandson Nathan Parker five shillings specie to him and his wife forever.

My will and desire is that all the rest of my property of every kind, so usually divided between my Daughters Mary Stephenina Charity Parker my Grand Son David Parker and my Grand Son Jason Hicks between and their wives forever And I constitute and appoint my Son Nathan Jenkins my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament making and disseminating all other As witness my Hand and Seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 1796. —

## Mary Mitchell's Will

In the name of God Amen I Mary Mitchell of Granville County and State of Virginia being in perfect mind and memory thank God to the Almighty God to make and ordain this my last Will and Testament my Seal Annexed. I God who gave it me my body I leave at the discretion of my executors my worldly estate Apportioned bequeath in the following manner — — — — —

First To Rebecca Webb Margaret Webb Nancy Webb and Sarah Gee I give all the property I now have or may hereafter die intestated of to be equally divided amongst them.

Second I hereby nominate and appoint John and Peter Webb sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament Attest Mary Mitchell my Hand and Seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of June One thousand seven hundred and ninety four.
