 Chest, two Pewter Dishes one Glass and two Plates one silver Spoon
 two Tea Plates one Silver Spoon Master and Petticoat one silver
 Spoon, one Looking Glass and Modern Wheel, one Stone Mallet
 one small Mallet, two small French Chairs, four
 pair Cards, one Stone Jug one Tin Container and Glass
 Tubs, one Silver Spoon one Silver Mug, one Silver Pot, one Heater
 and all my Books. It is my desire that my Money Accounts
 should be divided between Mary Shuttle and Ann Murrell
 except my Red Clock and Black Cornish. I give to Conira
 Mary Murrell, that with all necessary things which may be
 found that is my Property &c. It is my desire that should be
 divided by Robert Murrell as my Executor this being my last
 Will and Testament in which I have named all my
 loved and affined but this 3rd day of November in the Year
 of our Lord 1805.

Elijah Johnsons Will. In the Name of God Amen
 I Elijah Johnson of Northampton County and State of South Carolina
 being in my mind of perfect Sound mind and Memory
 thanks be to God therefore but calling to mind the Mortality of my
 Body do hereby make and give this my last Will and Testament in
 Manner and Form following that is to say

First and principally I commit my soul into the hands of God hoping
 to have full and full pardon for all my sins through the suffering
 of my Saviour Jesus and to inherit everlasting life as to
 my Body I commit it to the ground from whence it was taken
 to be buried in a Christian like decent Manner at the direction
 of my Executors hereafter named signed as touching all
 such temporal Parts as it hath pleased almighty God to be
 show upon me I give and bequeath them as follows

First I give that all my actual Debt be paid and discharged
 Item I give and bequeath to my Loving Wife all my Estate
 without Doubt & without Dissolving her Marriage

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Kettie my Negro
 Woman one & call her child Henry.

Item I give & bequeath to my Daughter Henry my Negro Girl
 Pats and Ned

Item I give & bequeath to my son Drury Johnson my Negro Boy
 Manks, Fox & Anthony.

Item I give & bequeath to my son Elias Johnson 196 acres of Land
 more or less and Plantations which James Lee & my Negro Man
 Manks Tom & John my Negro Woman Pats & Ned had in common
 and one Hand Murrells Kitchen.

Item I give & bequeath to my Loving Wife my Negro Murrell
 Patience Murrells among & my wife and desire is that she
 shall not give them out of the Family.

Item I do nominate & appoint my Loving Wife Henry son
 in law Elias Powell my whole and sole Executor of this my
 last Will and Testament. Reserving nevertheless and making
 void all other Wills herebefore made by me. In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 3rd day of January
 1805.

 it is appointed for all Men once to Die do make and give this my
 last Will and Testament in Manner and Form following. I give
 Here I give to my Daughter Rebecca Johnson five Shillings to her and
 her heirs forever
 Here I give to my son David Johnson five Shillings to him and his
 heirs forever
 Here I give to my Daughter Amy Pops five Shillings to
 her and her heirs forever
 Here I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Gray five Shillings
 My Will and desire is that said half of my Negro Chattels
 Niggers and Sheep and Swine one half of the Remainder
 of my Movable property to be equally Divided among
 my four Children Robert Johnson, Rebecca Johnson, Susan
 Johnson, and Charlotte Maxwell and the other half of the
 afore Movable property I leave to my beloved Wife Amy
 Johnson during her life and after her decease that the
 Remainder of said Property to be equally Divided among
 my four Children as the afore Movable half
 of my Estate is my Will and desire; and the hereby Court
 here and appoint my beloved son Bernaba Johnson and
 Robert Johnson my whole and sole Executors and Curators
 of this my last Will and Testament, In Witness
 whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 27th day of October one thousand eight hundred and

 I William Wimborn of State of North Carolina and County of
 Anson County being of sound and perfect Mind and Memory
 do hereby do this 27th day of November in the year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and six years, make publish this my last Will and
 Testament in Manner following that is to say, I give, My Will is that all my
 last Debts with my funeral Expences be paid
 Here I leave unto my loving Wife Sarah Wimborn the whole of my estate
 real and personal, during her Natural life When to my Children
 follows - Then I divide and divide unto my Son William Wimborn, the upper
 part of my land which says Dots West him, together with two acres of
 Purchase of Walter Beards also a piece of Land lying on Banks
 Purchase, joining John Hayes land & John Thomas land & Jonathan
 Winkles land between him & Dampney Bay to him his heirs forever
 Then I divide & divide unto my Son Dampney Wimborn the middle part
 of my Land joining Henry Winkles land & Jonathan Winkles
 Bay to him & his heirs forever
 Then I divide & divide unto my Son John Wimborn, the lower part of my Land
 joining John Hayes land, & Dampney Wimborn land of marked trees, Bay to
 him and his heirs forever
 Here I give & give unto my Son Henry Wimborn Ten Shillings to him
 Here I give & give unto my three Daughters Ann, Susan, July, Lefler &
 Dolly Winkles all my young Negroes, after the decease of my wife to
 be equally Divided amongst them by lot, if any should be
 born after the death of my Wife, they are to be divided in the same
 manner, My Will and desire is that my old Negro Man and Sarah
 should have her own Freedom of choice, to live with whomsoever of
 my Children suits her best, My Will and desire is after the death
 of my Wife all the remaining part of my Estate to be equally Divided
 amongst all my Children here & there alike, and thereby make
 and make my Son William Wimborn & my Grand Children
 Executors of this my last Will & Testament, In Witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 27th day of November
