

Allen Cotton's Will

- I Allen Cotton do make and declare this my last Will and Testament
- First I give to James Cotton Part my two tracts of Land lying in Chatham County adjacent to the town of Salisbury in the said County.
- Secondly I give to my beloved brother one Rogers Mann by the name of Eliza to him and his heirs forever.
- Thirdly I give to my two youngest brothers Willie and John and my sister Mary Cotton the three following Negroes to Willie I give to him this Negro forever to John I give Ephraim to him and his heirs forever and to Mary I give Selley to her and her heirs forever.
- Fourthly I give to my brother Henry Cotton Part one Negro belonging by the name of Kate to him and his heirs forever.
- After all my just debts being paid it is my will and desire that all the rest of my Negroes and the rest of my property to be equally divided between Willie, John, and Mary Cotton.
- September 23rd to 1795.

1795.
