 I Robert Peebles of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina
 being in perfect Mind and Memory do make & cause this to be my
 Last Will and Testament in Manner & Form following (Said)

First I do give & bequeath unto my beloved Wife Rebecca Peebles one Negro
 Man named Ben also Peter, Susan, Nancy, Esther, Ann, Susie,
 Hannah, Jack, Fanny, Maria, & John. I do give & bequeath to above
 mentioned Slaves to her who have been freed.

Secondly I do also give unto my beloved Wife all my Estate both real &
 Personal after paying my last Debts.
 (3) I do also nominate & appoint my Wife Executor to this my last
 Will & Testament, hereby authorizing all Acts hereunto by me
 made. In Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 Seal this 3rd day of February Anno Domini 1807.

William Jones's Will. In the Name of God
 Amen. William Jones of Northampton County State of North Carolina
 being weak of Body but of sound Mind & perfect Memory on this 12th
 Day of September 1806 do make & publish this to be my Last Will
 & Testament in Manner following:
 I do give & bequeath to my son William Jones known by the name of
 William Jones one Yellow Sulley of Blue Stripes to him & his Heirs forever
 I do to my son John Jones known by the name of John Jones
 One Slave Man;
 I do give & bequeath to my Son John Jones One Cow two Cows & calves to him & his
 Heirs forever
 I do bequeath to the said Widow Jones my land 50 Plantations whereon I now live
 until her Youngest Child comes to the Age of Eighteen Years then my land &

there is that the Land be sold the Money Equally Divided between
 her Two Children but after her Two Children shall be of Age before they come
 to the Age of Eighteen Years then that Case my Will & desire is that the
 Land be sold & the Money equally Divided between the said Widow
 Jones John Jones & William Jones as before mentioned.

After John Jones & William Jones as before mentioned
 then I do bequeath to the said Widow Jones all my House & Lot & all the Furniture
 until her Youngest Child comes to the Age of Eighteen Years then my
 wish & desire is that all the said Furniture be sold & the Money equally
 divided between her Two Children & if the Children should die before they
 come to the Age of Eighteen Years then in that Case my Will & desire is that
 the Furniture be sold & the Money Equally divided between the said Widow
 Jones John Jones & William Jones to them their Heirs & Heirs forever.

My Will & desire is that all my Stock of Hogs Cows & Cattle be sold for the
 Use of the Plantations
 My Will & desire is that as soon as convenient after my death that my
 Executors will sell all the property that I have not bequeathed by this Will
 for the purpose of paying my last debts & I am as before said.

I considerate persons I do name my trusty Friends John Thompson Executor
 to this my Last Will & Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my Hand & Seal this 12th day of September in the Year
 of our Lord the Thousand Eight hundred & 6th.
