and wherein lies my last Will and Testament in Manner
and form following: (W^t) first on e^r present: I Henry
call my soul unto the hand of Almighty God this day
it was signing on the Thirtyness M^l of my life
desire to have full remission of all my sins and my
body delivered to the Earth from whence it came to be buried
in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Country
men after death, and to what M^l Estate it Leth them
God to help me with spise and riper of a maner and
form following (unprovided) there fore am I command
unto my beloved wife Sally Sonny my soleil House and
midnight Capair and thereby to her she this power
to have full power during time of her

Then think not my Distrustful Poly Society deserves her
political life and our Negro girl by the name of Betty
and the success the Dark Negro girl shall have among
that time also our father Dr. Spurgeon which she has
as Pippin, and after her death before the Dark Negro
and her buried together with the Dr. Spurgeon to be
Equally buried between all her children when others
to other have power

Equally dear
Sister, to them all their love forever
These dear and my Beloved wife Sally shortly the now of
of my plantation. Daughters of these names together with
the plantation where know her son also Deleah, Mary, George the
Frank, Harry, Eric, Anthony, Dick, Mary, Miles & Peter
Caroline, Rose, Rachel and Amy, all these names, all my
house hold kitchen furniture, all my plantation library
all my stock of cattle and Horses and Sheep few head of
horses among her He sold her in order to support herself
and House and educate my Son James Henry shortly
and of my said wife shall Mary before my said
son comes to the age of twenty one years from the date

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have my Mill and chose so that my said Property to be
Divided between my said Wife and Son in the manner
of my Executors here after made and so to by the use of the
Plantation house now live during his Natural life
and one third part of all my Money and other income
also half of my Household & Kitchen furniture, half of
all my Stocks of Every kind I give to my said Wife
in this manner.

My Will & devise is that after my Son James Henry
Savory comes to the age of Twenty one years hee have the
Plantation thought of Lethbridge wherein the remainder
the thing of my Negroes and their houses the remaining
one half of house & all Kitchen furniture half of
the my Stock of Every kind and after his Death of my
said Negroes give him the plantation wherein hee have been
since my son Son James Henry Savory should bee
before hee be lawfull yeres or come to the age of Twenty
one. And in that case if his one half of the Negroes and
there houses that are mentioned are due to any Brother or
sister Henry shall also half of the household and Kitchen
furniture and half of all kind of Stock and the other
half of the said Negroes and their houses. The other
half of the Household Kitchen furniture Plantation houses
cells and Stock of Every kind to my Sister James Henry
Savory and of either of them should bee without issue
I fel you bestention of these the saids. They in that case
the Sonnes to have the whole and of both should bee
without lawfull yeres as above. Yeres the whole to be equally
Divided between all the Children of my Sister James Henry
Savory and there heirs forever.

Friend and have this power now
that he can my Son James Henry Swain should die without any
trouble. You will be glad to know to the age of Twenty one years
after the death of my wife Sally Swain - - you

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After the Land and Plantation above known have unto my
Nephew Henry Taylor and his heirs forever
that Henry and his heirs forever shall bear before
him every year the sum of Henry Twenty Shillings Sterling before
he comes of age or has lawful power thereon that
he may give and bequeath the Land and Plantation
the Daughter of John Hause unto my Nephew
Jacob Hause and his heirs forever
then thence to the remainder of my Estate not already so
given away together with my third part of the old Slave
Male to be sold in order to pay my last debts
and my Trustee for appoint my Nephew Mr. Jno. Sally
Son of my friend deceased Daughter Miles Daugh-
ter and my Family, my wife and all my Children
Executive of this my last Will and Testament Revoking
all former Wills hitherto made by me and declaring
the same to be my last Will & Testimony whereof these
bequests set my hand and affixed my seal this 1st day
of September 1805.

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Jonathan Patterson Will

I Jonathan Patterson of Nathaniel County in State
of North Carolina, being of perfect sense and memory
of Mind do this twentieth day of November in the year
of our Lord Eighteen hundred and four make Publick
and record this my last Will and Testament in Writing
and from following, that is to say —

First I give and bequeath unto my
Son Henry Patterson the whole of my Land situate
containing two hundred acres to be the
same more or less unto him and his heirs forever
and still leaving my wife with what if it should
be a son he shall have one half my Land with
Husband, but if a Daughter she shall receive in
equal share with the rest of my Daughters (23) —
viz. Elizabeth, Mary, Rachel, Rosalie Patterson etc the
rest of my Estate which I make this, which I give here
described and bequeath unto them and their lawful
Heirs the whole of my Land and Possessions
Property to my living wife Sally Patterson
to her use and behoof her life time in Manner
except that which those left to be the rest and that
none of my Children shall like her from making
use of any part of my said Estate during the said
time of term, and further leave it to the direction
of my Executor to sell my Land and Possessions —
