

Thomas Mann's Will

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Mann of the County of North Carolina  
in the County of New Hanover being through the abundant mercy and goodness  
of God though weak in body yet of a sound and perfect understanding and memory  
do constitute this my last Will and Testament and desire that it may be  
witnessed by all as such. First give my body to the Earth from whence it was  
taken, as for my funeral Services I may be buried without pomp or State at  
the discretion of my dear wife and my executors hereafter named as to my  
widely established and justly ordered order that all my debts be paid.

First I send unto my living wife the House wherein I now live and the  
Plantation with Stock of all kinds as Horses Cattle Hogs Sheep &c  
also two Negro men one named Tom the other named Lee and my  
servant woman Frances Rose during her natural life or widowhood  
and after her death or marriage to decent with my son Frederick  
Mann.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Anna Martha one  
Negro girl named Phoebe the house & garden thereunto belonging and feather  
bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Sarah Barbara  
one Negroe girl named Anna to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Grand Daughter Elizabeth  
Anna one Negroe girl named Anna to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Frederick Mann one  
Negroe named Sam or Roger one Lad and one named Anna also  
one horse moccle Shady and John Made and I do desire and  
desire unto my beloved son Frederick Mann all the Land and  
plantation wherow I now live with the Stock of all kinds as Horses  
Cattle Hogs Sheep &c with all the movable of all kinds in tools  
and instruments with all things whatsoever belonging or in anywise  
pertaining to me to have and his heirs forever after the decease  
of his Mother.

Lately

I partly I do constitute this my last Will and Testament and make my  
beloved Son Frederick Mann Eldest son of Daniel Mann  
to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament.  
Dated this \_\_\_\_\_ in the year of our Lord 1791 whereat I have set  
my hand having signed Read and Seal.

William Thompson's Will

In the name of God Amien the 24th day of December in the year of our  
Lord 1792 William Thompson of the County of North Carolina  
Carolina being sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory  
and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is ap-  
pointed for all men once to die I make and ordain this my last Will and  
Testament that is to say as follows.

In the first place I give and bequeath to Anna my dear wife the plantation  
whereon I now live with all the household furniture Utensils houses and every  
thing else I am now possessed with. I give her also all my Stock of money kind  
with all my Negroes namely George, Kate, Beck, Eliza, Nancy, Anna,  
Elancy, Cherry and Henry & her and her heirs forever.

Item I give unto William Thompson a tract of land whereon he can have one  
hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto William Thompson Son of John Thompson the land  
whereon the said John Thompson doth formerly live to him and his  
heirs forever.
