That one third part to Joshua Warren one third part to Susannah Debary and one third part to my seven Grand Children namely Robert Samuel William Thomas Sept Sarah & Elizabeth Warren sons and Daughters to John Warren dec. & my Will and desire is that my Executors divide the foregoing part collate the residue of my estate in manner and form following, viz give my son Joshua Warren one third part and Susannah Debary one third part and the other third part to be sold for the benefit of my mentioned seven Grand Children and my desire is that my executors pay each of my Grand Children their part of said residue as they may arrive to the age of say boys twenty one years and Girls to the age of eighteen.

Now Further it is my Will and desire that Sept Williams, Arthur Williams, Joel Sherrard and Richard Hefson or either two of them appear and divide all the before mentioned residue of my estate without selling two thirds parts as before mentioned and if either of the Legatee refuse to take their respective parts as it may be proportioned by the above mentioned persons my desire is that the part that should be refused may be equally divided among the other Legatees before mentioned. I also constitute and appoint my friends Joshua Warren and Abner Debary my whole and sole executors to this my last Will and Testament revoking all others. In the name of God Amen Winckea William Woody of Northampton County in North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit I give my Soul to God who gave it trusting in the merits of my blessed Lord and Saviour for the remission of all my sins and my body to be buried at the discretion of my friends.

Now I bequeath to my living wife Rebecca Woody the use of my Land & Plantation with all my Servants my Stock of every kind and whatever shall be deemed my estate during her widowhood to raise my Children on, and after the end of her widowhood or life I desire my Land to be divided between my three sons John Woody, Winckea William Woody, & Thomas Woody to them and their Heirs forever.

Now I desire that at the end of the life or widowhood of my wife
that all my estate namely Dick Quire, Debt, Lucy Wherry
with their increase with all my stock of every kind with all
that is deemed my estate that I have not as yet willed away
to be equally divided among my four following children John
Hinckley, Thomas and my little Daughter Rebecca with the
expected one that my wife now goes with, share and share alike
between them and their heirs forever. And Lastly I
appoint my beloved wife sole and sole Executrix of this my
last Will and Testament this 5th day of December 1795.
