

# Anthony Moors Will

In the Name of God Amen. I Anthony Moors of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and Memory but feeling the frailty of human life do make this my last will and Testament in the following first I recommend my soul to God that gave it and my body to be buried in a decent and becoming manner

First I give and Bequeath unto my Son Anthony Moors one half of my York Land which he now possesses to him and his heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Son John Moors one half of my York Land which he now possesses to him and his heirs forever

Item I give unto my beloved Wife Sarah Moors the plantation which she now lives with all my land lying on the South side of the Beemster Swamp during her life a widowhood

Item I give and Bequeath unto my three youngest Daughters namely Betty Rebecca and Polly Moore the plantation which I now live with all the Land belonging to me on the South side of the Beemster Swamp to be equally divided Between the said Betty Rebecca and Polly Moore after the death or Marriages of my beloved Wife Sarah Moors to them & their heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Moore one Horse saddle and one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle to her and her heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca Moore one Horse saddle and saddle with one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle one hundred & fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Polly Moore one Horse saddle & saddle with one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle one hundred & fifty dollars to her & her heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my Son Henry Moore three Negroes namely Nanny Hannahs Agga, & Martha and one Scurase which he has had them in possession to him and his heirs forever

Item I give & Bequeath unto my Son Anthony Moore three Negroes namely Ruth, Liza & Sherry with all their Scurase which he has possessed them to him & his heirs forever

Item

I give and Bequeath unto my Son John Moors three Negroes named Ned to him and his heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my Son Richard Moore three Negroes named J Walter, Joshua & Jancy to him and his heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Moore three Negroes namely Betty & Kellie, with their Scurase to her and her heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Moore three Negroes namely Charlotte, and Henry to her & her heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Rebecca Moore three Negroes namely Eliza, Liza & Pat, to her & her heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my Daughter Polly Moore three Negroes namely Joe, Maggie & Kate to her & her heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my beloved Wife Sarah Moors three Negroes namely Amy, Dany, Carter, & Nelson and I also give unto my beloved Wife one Horse saddle & saddle with one hundred & fifty dollars with one half of my household & kitchen furniture

with fifty barrels of corn two cows and Piggy and ten head of her and her heirs forever

Item

I give & Bequeath unto my daughter Anne one hundred Dollars to her and her heirs forever

Item

I also give unto my beloved Wife Sarah Moors one bed & furniture and five head of cattle to her & her heirs forever

Item

All the remainder of my Estate I leave to be equally divided between five of my Children namely Anthony, John, Betty, Rebecca and Polly Moore at my death

Item

I appoint my beloved Wife Sarah Moors and my Son Anthony & John Moors to execute this my last will & Testament

Lastly

I make known this my last will & Testament, reading and explaining & disallowing all former Wills by me made

Witness my hand and seal this 27 day of March 1804

The Nuncupative Will of Anthony Moore dec'd June 5, 1804

Some time preceding his death in his last sickness gave unto his wife Sarah Moore Twenty Bushells of Wheat, divided unto his Son John Moore his Negro Dick, Black Pot, and that he further wished his requests to be taken as part of his last Will & Testament which was proved the last given under our hands this day & year above.

Turner Bridgers's Will

In the town of St. Louis I Turner Bridgers of Northampton State of North Carolina being at this time in a low state of health and of sound Mind & Memory my Will and desire is after all my just debts are paid I give my property as follows—  
First I give with unto my brother William Bridgers his share in the plantation in Calm, Pompey, Maryland, East, James, Sacks, Virginia, and his share in the same place, Calm, and Sacks, to him and his heirs forever—  
Second I give with unto my friend and neighbor James Day four hundred and fifty Dollars to him & his heirs forever—  
Third I give with unto my half of all my land unto my brother William Bridgers to him & his heirs forever—  
Fourth I give with unto my brother William Bridgers the other half of my land I give with unto John Webb Bridgers to him and his heirs forever—  
Fifth I give with unto my brother William Bridgers all the rest of my property he have and his heirs forever—  
Last I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother William Bridgers Executor of this my last Will and Testament in which I bequeath unto him the sum of \$1000 and I do hereby seal this 13 day of March 1804

Intends the Gifting of Moses Brew Dec'd and yet given in the Nuncupative Will but given verbally to Eliza Brew—  
One fine sheet green Table 1 base and bottle of flat long one coffee table one iron handle stool one silver one silver one set of shoe makers tools some Ring some glass some bottle and glass some silver plate & dishes in day 2 Peter spoons & 10 Carthen Plates two dishes & Carthen bowl 1 set of cups & saucers in day tea spoons sugar wash Dishes put in Pepper Carthen Mixture Sweet 3 glass tumblers & 1 tin coffee pot in put salt stand one glass Quencher & Sweet bottle one glass handle one base of Carons and box one iron Spoon of Roopers wooden ware 1 base of knives and forks & 1 base of silver Knives & bottles and 3 bottles one glass Whistle one Glass Whistle 1 set of Carons one Horse saddle and all my wearing clothes & shoe brushes & hair combs & Measur Bags one set black Whistle & 1 set of 3 flag bottom sitting chair the saw for the plantation where I live one of Bushells salt 2 boxes of leather 1 bottle hair Ointment & 1 tin furniture
