

# Anthony Moore's Will

In the Name of God Amen. I Anthony Moore, son of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but failing to mind the Mortality & uncertainty of life do make this my last will and Testament in manner following first recommending my soul to god that gave it and my body to the dust to be buried in a decent, and becoming manner.

- First Son Give and Bequeath unto my son Anthony Moore one half of my York Land which he now belongs to him and his heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son John Moore one half of my York Land which he now belongs to him & his heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Moore the plantation whereon I now live with all my land lying on the South side of the Conocchee Swamp during her life a widowhood.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my two youngest Daughters namely Bettye Robins and Betty Moore the plantation whereon I now live with all the land belonging to me on the south side of the Conocchee Swamp to be equally divided between the said Bettye Robins and Betty Moore after the death of a marriage of my beloved wife Sarah Moore to them & their heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Moore one Horse bell and Saddle with one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle and furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Robina Moore one Horse bell and Saddle with one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle and furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my daughter Betty Moore one Horse bell and Saddle with one hundred Dollars with five head of cattle and furniture to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son Henry Moore three Negroes namely Hannah, Agga, & Maria and two horses whom he has had them in possession to him and his heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son Anthony Moore three Negroes namely Dick, Luke & Henry with all their horses whom he has kept from him & his heirs forever.

- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son John Moore three Negroes named Ned to him and his heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son Richard Moore three Negroes named Will, Justice & Fancy to him and his heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Moore three Negroes namely Polly & Phillip with their horses & household furniture.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Moore three Negroes named Charlotte and Henry to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Robina Moore three Negroes namely Eliza, Lucy & Sam to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Betty Moore three Negroes namely Dick, Agga & Cate to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Moore, four Negroes namely Lucy, Darg, Castor & Shadrack and also give unto my beloved wife one Horse, Bridle & Saddle worth one hundred & twenty dollars with one half of my household & kitchen furniture with fifty Dollars to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my daughter Robina Moore one hundred Dollars to her and her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my beloved wife Sarah Moore one hundred Dollars and five head of cattle to her & her heirs forever.
- Item Give and Bequeath unto my son John Moore to be equally divided between five of my children namely Anthony, Henry, Betty, Robina and Betty Moore at my death.
- Item Appoint my beloved wife Sarah Moore and my son Anthony & John Moore to execute this my last will & Testament.
- Item Affy I conjure this my last will & Testament, swearing and affirming & disallowing all former Wills by me made.
- Witnessing these presents at my hand and seal this 27<sup>th</sup> day of March 1804

The Municipalite Will of Anthony Moore late Dec 5 1804

Some time preceding to his death in his last sickness gave unto  
his wife Sarah Moore Twenty bushels of Wheat, Sixteen  
wheats his Son John Moore his old Negro Dick Black Dog,  
and that he further wished his legatees to be taken as  
part of his last Will & Testament which was proved this day  
given under our hand this day & year above

Turner Bridger's Will

In the town of 400 Anna I turne Bridger of Antonapher & State of Missouri  
living at this time in as low state by reason of some Disease & Decay of my body  
and senses after all my just debts are paid I give my property as following  
to my stepson who is my brother William Bridger Justice of the Peace  
Nelson County Missouri Esq. James Sarah Anna Lucy, Mary, Charles  
George, Clarissa and Emily to him and his family  
to my stepson who is my friend and neighbour James Lucy four  
hundred dollars to him the same  
to my stepson one half of all my land and my brother William  
Bridger to him & his family  
the other half of my land I give to my brother William Bridger to  
him and his family

Further give unto my brother William Bridger all the rest of my  
property to him and his heirs forever

I do hereby nominate and appoint my brother William Bridger  
Executor of this my last will and Testament to witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this 13 day of March 1804

and glass see also Peter plates & dishes for dog Peter spoons &  
Forks 10 Easter Plates two dishes 52 Castilian bowls 1 set of  
Spoon & knives of dog tea Spoons sugar and Butter fork  
Pepper Easter Vinegar Court 3 glass tumblers 1 Pen  
coffee pot tea pot salt stand one glass Quaister 3 Quart  
Bottles one glass Harkle one base of Glasses and box one box  
8 pieces of Porous Woods Ware 1 base of knives and forks a  
pair of Spoons Tongs & butter ad kettle ad 2 Billy on glass  
Whale oil Cetia Whale 1 pt of Gades de Havre and also  
my Dining Cloth 3 sets Brushing 2 base for lids & Measures  
Box one pt Cast Whale & Cr. Yoke 5 flag bottom setting being  
the same for the Plantation where now lies 3 p. Bushells salt  
2 bushels of leather 1 Belli hair Bush & tin funnel
