In the name of
 long week in body but in perfect sound mind and memory
 know that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and
 a give this my last will and testament and First command
 my soul into the hands of almighty god, and my body to the
 dust to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discre-
 sion of my Executors and my worldly Estate I leave with the Lord
 both blessed and with I give and dispose of in the following
 manner and form (To wit) — I Give and bequeath the use of the
 whole of my Estate Real and personal to my beloved wife
 Elizabeth Mungar during her natural life or widowhood
 I give to my son James Mungar all my slaves to wit —
 plantations to him and his heirs forever Likewise unto my
 named as follows Hugh Jacob Jeffry, ship, pleasant, buoy
 and ferry they are their several to him and his heirs
 forever Likewise two feather beds and furniture Likewise
 one horse, called Miller bridle and saddle to him & his
 heirs forever — I give to my son three negroes named
 as follows olive Sarah & Henry which he hath possessed them
 and their several to him and his heirs forever Likewise
 one feather bed and furniture he has possessed Likewise
 two cows and half in his possession Likewise one side
 saddle in his possession to him and his heirs forever
 I give to my granddaughter Sarah but one negro named grace
 she and her several to her & her heirs forever
 I give to my daughter Drusilla Barnes nine negroes named
 as follows Carter, Selah, Rose, Jonas, Emily, Anthony, Cherry
 Humphrey and Mary they and their several to her and her heirs
 forever; one side saddle two feather beds and furniture and one
 one sheet painted blue to her and her heirs forever
 The residue of my Estate cattle Hogs sheep and all my
 stock of every kind that is not above mentioned and also of
 my household goods and furniture and my crop of corn I leave
 to be equally divided between my son James Mungar
 and my daughter Drusilla Barnes to them and their heirs for
 ever hereby appoint Drusilla Smith John Daniel and my son James
 Mungar my whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament
 and I hereby dissolve Powell and I command all and every other
 former wills bequeaths and bequests religious and testamentary to
 be of no effect and I command that this first day of September 1801 —

In the name of God Amen I William Glover of Northampton County
 State of North Carolina being weak in body but of perfect mind
 and memory do constitute & make this my last Will and
 Testament in form and manner following that is to say First
 of all I wish my Will and give with to make provision for
 the payment of all my Just debts it is my Will and desire
 for my beloved wife Sally to keep all my Estate together for
 Eight Year and at the Expiration of which it is my desire
 & Will that she be bound to sell & pay off my debts
 the negroes I now possess with the same & divide with the rest
 of my Estate between my beloved wife and my children and
 last of all I appoint my beloved wife my Executor of this
 my last Will & Testament with my beloved Brother John
 Glover Executor — In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
 hand & seal this 9th day of December 1801
