

William Mungers Will

In the name of God Amen I William Munger of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament but first and foremost I command my Seal to Almighty God who giveth me grace and certain hope of an resurrection of the same and as for what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow upon me I dispose of as followeth.

I give I send the use of my Land called a named Houghton Chimes for Cows and Calves two Ewes and Lamb three Sheep and pigs eight head of Stock One bed and furniture thereto Savon one dish two plates One spinning wheel One pair of Cards One Chest one Loom one Millot spinning her self & each one water pail and tray unto my wife Catharine Munger during her natural life and after her decease I leave it unto my son Michael Munger to him and his Heirs forever and also leave a gift unto my said son Michael Munger One Son and pigs to be his and his Heirs forever —

I give and bequeath unto my Son John Munger One bed and furniture One Spa and pigs to him and his Heirs forever I give and bequeath to my Son Barnwell Munger One bed and furniture to him and his Heirs forever — I give unto my eldest daughter Sarah Munger One bed and furniture four head of Cattle called here to her and her Heirs forever.

I give likewise unto my Daughter Martha & Henry Munger each of them One bed and furniture to them and their Heirs forever — I give unto Lucy Munger the sum of four pounds Virginia Money to her and her Heirs forever and if she should decease under age I leave it to be equally divided between the whole of my children and all the residue of my whole estate to be sold by my Executors and the money to be equally divided among all my Children and my wife except Sarah and she her equal part of

of the money that the estate should fetch only excepting the amount of the Stock of cattle to each of them and their Heirs forever and I do hereby appoint my Sons Henry Munger Septer Munger and Barnwell Munger to be my Executors and sole executors As witness my Hand and Seal this 9th day of April 1792.
