In the name of God amen. I John Waltherp of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following Verbe

Item I leave unto my wife Mary Waltherp all that part of the tract of land my father Michael Waltherp left me, also all the rest of my property of what kind soever during her widowhood, except such part of the estate as my Executors hereafter mentioned shall think proper to sell to discharge my debts and then the residue to my wife as above mentioned, and in case my wife should marry then I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Waltherp all my Land and other property left as above to her and her heirs forever. Lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Mary Waltherp Executrix and Thomas Barrett Executor of this my last Will and Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto put my hand and affixed my seal this second day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred and ninety five

John Sawworth's Will

In the name of God amen. I John Sawworth of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in his perfect mind and memory as one thanks be to God for the same do hereby in and with my body, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner form as followeth and desire it may be reviewed by all as such. Well Informed I give my soul to God from whom Originally it proceeded and my body to the dust from whence it was taken to be decently buried at the discretion of my Dear wife Anna Sawworthy.

Item I give and bequeath to my son John Sawworthy the plantation I have thought of Robert Sells this part I granted by deed to Henry Saffin 4th April 1787 excepted; I give and bequeath the residue of land as aforementioned to him and his heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that after my wife Anna Sawworthy decease that my son Henry Sawworthy shall dwell and support upon the plantation whereon I now live to him and his heirs forever.

Item I leave my Daughter Anna Saffin a negro man named Will during his natural life but in case she should marry then I give the same to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Sawworthy the sum of two hundred pounds Current money of this State to be raised out of my estate to be paid to him at the decease of my wife or when he comes at the age of twenty one years to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary West one Negro Girl named Pina also one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Lydia Sawworthy my Negro girl named Buster also one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Maria Sawworthy my Negro girl named Sude also one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I leave to my wife Anna Sawworthy the plantation whereon I now live also the remainder of my estate not heretofore given or mentioned

during

during the term of her natural life but in case she should marry
 a second time at her desire which first must happen, then my wife
 and I desire that the remainder of my estate except the
 plantation to Henry Sawinthy as aforementioned shall be
 equally divided amongst my Children except Sarah Rutland
 John Sawinthy & Ann Daffin who have heretofore had
 their portions to them and their heirs forever, and I also
 desire that my wife Ann Sawinthy should educate these my
 youngest children of profits of my estate in her house without
 bringing any charge against them or their estate. Lastly
 to nominate constitute and appoint Thomas Rhodes and
 Henry Sawinthy whole and sole executor of this my last
 Will and Testament utterly annulling and revoking all former
 Wills by me made heretofore and do acknowledge this to
 be my last Will and Testament. We Witnesses
 have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this the

William Rutlands Will

In the name of God Amen I William Rutland of the
 State of North Carolina and County of Northampton being of sound
 and perfect mind and memory (Blessed be God) Do this third day
 of September in the year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred
 and ninety make and publish this my last Will and Testament
 in manner and form following.

First I give to my beloved wife Sarah Rutland the land and plantation
 whereon I have lived during her widowhood by her to be fully
 possessed and enjoyed.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Lemuel Rutland the land and
 plantation whereon I have lived lying on the North side of the Cape
 branch and that to be the land for him and not to have any part
 out the said Cape branch but all on the North side I give to my
 son Lemuel Rutland his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Miles Rutland all the rest and
 part of my lands lying on the South side of the aforementioned Cape
 branch I give to the said Miles Rutland his heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my beloved wife Sarah Rutland and she or either
 of them also four cows and calves and one feather bed and furniture
 by her to be fully possessed and enjoyed.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Rutland One feather bed to her
 her heirs and assigns forever. I likewise give to my beloved
 wife Sarah Rutland all the remainder part of my feather bed
 and furniture which is not given away to her use during her
 widowhood, I likewise give to my beloved wife Sarah Rutland all
 my stock of sheep to her use during her natural life and after her
 death to be equally divided between my four youngest children namely
 Sarah Rutland, Miles Rutland, Lemuel Rutland, Rebecca Rutland
 and Abigail Rutland to them their heirs and assigns forever for
 ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my wife Sarah Rutland twelve head of hogs
 by her fully to be possessed and enjoyed.

Item I give to my son Abner Rutland the sum of twenty pounds of money
 to be raised out of my goods and moveable estate by him freely to be
 possessed and enjoyed.

Item I give to my son James Rutland the sum of five shillings.
