County & State of North Carolina being Weak in Body but
of sound Mind & Memory do hereby bequeath all my
for the same, do make & publish this my last Will &
Testament in Manner & Form following, that is to say
First In the first Place I do my Will that all my
last debts should be paid as speedily as possible
Second, I give to my Beloved Wife Sarah Adams and
Heir of the Plantation whom I have used during
my natural life together with a tract of land my other
Property which I give to her then this power say
the Month

Firstly I give to Charles Adams my dear son and my
dear son William Adams to him this his power

Secondly To my son Moses Adams I give my old Plantation
whom he now lives to him this his power

Thirdly To my son William Adams I give the third Part of
the Land I now live upon the Part whom he
has made a Settlement to him this his power

Fourthly To my son Richmond Adams I give one third Part of
the Plantation whom I now live upon the Part whom he
to him this his power

Fifthly To my son Randolph Adams I give one third Part
of the Plantation whom I now live upon the Part whom he
to him this his power

Sixthly I give to my Daughter Mary Adams five shillings
the whole of what my remain of my Property to
be sold and equally divided between Charles
Adams, William Adams, Richmond Adams
