

Francis Parker's Will

In the name of God Amen.

I Francis Parker of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but in perfect sound mind and memory and disposing mind thanks be to Almighty God for the same and calling to mind that it is now appointed for all mankind to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following first and foremost I give and bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God relying on the meritorious blood of my Beloved Saviour to have full remission of all my sins and my body I commit to the earth from whence it came to be buried in a Christian like manner at the direction of my Executrix hereafter named and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow me with I give and dispose of in manner and form following.

Amphimedon Give and bequeath unto my four daughters to wit Peggy Parker, Penicilla Parker, Martha Parker and Susanna Parker twelve Dollars apiece to be raised out of my estate after my death to them and their heirs forever.

Item I lead unto my beloved wife Sarah Parker the use of my plantation whereon I now live containing One hundred acres with all the appurtenances thereto belonging during her natural life and after decease I give and bequeath my said plantation together with all improvements unto my son Nathaniel Parker and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Parker the land and plantation whereon he now lives containing One hundred acres to the same more or less to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Parker the land and plantation that my said son has now in possession together with all improvements to him and his heirs forever containing One hundred acres to the same more or less.

Item I lead unto my beloved wife Sarah Parker the use of all my property of what kind soon not already given away during her natural life and after decease my will and desire is that the whole of said property should be sold

to my executors hereafter named and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between my four daughters to wit Mary Turner, Sarah Hayes, Peggy Parker, Penicilla Parker Martha Parker and Susanna Parker who shall and shall alike to them and their heirs forever.

Item I constitute and appoint my son William Parker and my son Lewis Parker my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament notwithstanding all former wills by me made before this whereof I have heretofore set my hand and seal this tenth day of December 1798.

William Rainey's Will.

In the Name of God Amen I William Rainey of Northampton & State of North Carolina being sick, tho. of perfect mind & memory, willingly, mind the mortality of my body knowing that it is aptinent for all men once to die do make this my last Will & Testament this the Twenty first Day of March One thousand seven hundred and ninety nine, and as it has pleasted Almighty God to bestow me with a few worldly goods I give & bequeath as follows W^m Rainey is that my body may be decently buried, and my funeral expenses paid at the discretion of my Executors: For the distribution of my goods I hereby give & bequeath in the following manner First the house and in possession of my son William Rainey all my personal Estate collectively & individually to him One part of Land lying in Granville County State of Virginia containing by Estimation One Hundred Ten Acres more or less to him Agnes which are Henry, Betty, Nelly, Eliza, Sally, Gertrude & Hens as one part of the same & a Store House One part of cattle, Tercy brace of Hogs for hogs & furniture with every other Article of Kitchen & Household furniture and a plantation Estimate consisting of two tables seven Chairs and one writing Chair & a chest for Trunk & a settle one Dresser three chairs a stool, plates three dozen glasses three candlesticks & dishes of a large size & a small t^e, eighteen Easterly, State two or potts Vene for Hogs, three Earthen Pots with several quantities of Clays & earthen & one or two fine ploughs, horses, mowers, scythes, hoes, &c
