third share to her and to her heirs forever—
I give and bequeath unto my brother Henry Luke one Negro fellow
named Jack one further half and one third share to him and his
heirs forever of the Maryland plantation to be equally divided
between Randolph Luke and Henry Luke to them and their
heirs forever— I give bequeath unto my brother David
Luke five shillings to him and his heirs forever—
I give bequeath unto David Young five shillings to him
and his heirs forever— I give unto my brother William
Luke five shillings to him and his heirs forever—
I give bequeath unto Dorothy G. one and a half Negro Girl
named Hagar to her and her heirs forever—
I give and bequeath unto Martha Young and Negro Boy
named William to him and his heirs forever— I give and
bequeath unto my brother Randolph Luke & Henry Luke and
David Roman one share to be equally divided between them
